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PREFACE

Supplementary Estimates for the General Revenue Fund and the Lottery Fund are presented for thirteen departments of the Government of Alberta. The Legislative Assembly will be asked to appropriate spending authority from these Funds, pursuant to the *Appropriation (Supplementary Supply) Act, 2005 (No. 2)*. These Supplementary Estimates reflect the same budgeting methodology as the 2005-06 Estimates which were tabled on April 13, 2005.

These Supplementary Estimates will authorize a \$1,531,247 increase in voted Expense and Equipment / Inventory Purchases, a \$234,150,000 increase in voted Capital Investment, and a \$5,000,000 increase in voted Lottery Fund Payments.

Definition of Terms:

Adjusted Gross Amount includes amounts voted in the 2005-06 Estimates, changes in expense authorized by section 24(2) of the *Financial Administration Act* for net budgeting, and carry-over of 2004-05 unused capital appropriations, pursuant to section 28.1 of the *Financial Administration Act*.

Net budgeting provides a means of budgeting for goods and services which are subject to variable demand and for which a credit or recovery is received from external or internal sources. The Supplementary Estimates show the total gross amount, credit or recovery, and the net amount for net budgeted initiatives. If, during the fiscal year, expenses and credits or recoveries are both expected to exceed the amount budgeted, Treasury Board may increase the voted authorization pursuant to section 24(2) of the *Financial Administration Act*. If the budgeted credits or recoveries are not realized, the gross expense is managed so that it does not exceed the gross estimate less the shortfall in credits or recoveries, except where noted. These net budgeting provisions also apply to capital investment.

This Supplementary Estimate of \$99,000,000 is requested to provide:

- \$8,100,000 for Grant MacEwan College to support one-time costs associated with the implementation of degree programs including curriculum development, library upgrades and faculty recruitment;
- \$15,000,000 to match a private donation to the University of Calgary;
- \$80,500,000 for additional post-secondary facilities infrastructure; and
- \$4,600,000 reduction in Student Loan Relief Benefit payments.

REASON SUPPLEMENTARY ESTIMATE REQUESTED

This Supplementary Estimate of \$288,289,000 is requested to provide:

- \$169,600,000 for disaster assistance as follows. Pursuant to section 4 of the *Fiscal Responsibility Act*, this assistance will be funded from the Sustainability Fund:
 - \$154,600,000 increased provincial costs for Agriculture Insurance and Lending Assistance arising from retroactive changes to the Canadian Agricultural Income Stabilization (CAIS) program benefit calculations. These costs are solely related to beef, dairy and other ruminants;
 - \$10,000,000 for infrastructure projects in support of Alberta beef slaughter and value-added beef processing sectors;
 - \$3,000,000 for the beef product and market development programs; and
 - \$2,000,000 for an enhanced age verification initiative.

- \$118,689,000 increased provincial costs for Agriculture Insurance and Lending Assistance, as follows:

- \$47,035,000 for provincial share of crop insurance premiums;
- \$109,000 for wildlife damage and compensation; and
- \$71,545,000 for retroactive changes to CAIS program benefit calculations that are not related to disaster assistance, and increased provincial administration costs.

Under the Disaster Financial Assistance Arrangements, (the federal/provincial cost-sharing agreement), the province expects to recover approximately \$110,600,000 from the Government of Canada;
- \$285,000 for the 2005 Peace River Disaster Recovery Program, to compensate residents, small businesses and others for losses resulting from overland flooding due to groundwater seepage in the area over the period of January 23 to March 14, 2005 and an ice jam on the North Heart River on March 9, 2005;
- \$450,000 for the 2005 City of Wetaskiwin Disaster Recovery Program, to compensate residents, small businesses and others for losses resulting from overland flooding due to two severe storms with heavy rainfall in the city on June 25 and 30, 2005; and
- \$500,000 for the 2004 Municipal District of Lesser Slave River Disaster Recovery Program, to compensate residents, small businesses and others for losses resulting from overland flooding on September 2, 2004 in the Municipal District of Lesser Slave River, pursuant to an Order in Council passed on June 7, 2005.
