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PREFACE

Supplementary Supply Estimates for the General Revenue Fund are presented for five departments of the Government of Alberta. The Legislative Assembly will be asked to appropriate spending authority from the General Revenue Fund, pursuant to the *Appropriation (Supplementary Supply) Act, 2007.* These Supplementary Supply Estimates reflect the same budgeting methodology as the 2006-07 Estimates which were tabled on March 22, 2006.

These Supplementary Supply Estimates will authorize a \$393,516,000 increase in voted Expense and Equipment / Inventory Purchases, and will also authorize a transfer of \$530,000 from the Capital Investment vote of the Department of Infrastructure and Transportation to the Capital Investment vote of the Department of Service Alberta.

On December 15, 2006, a restructuring of government departments was announced. This changed the responsibilities of some departments, created new departments and eliminated others. Amounts shown as **Adjusted Gross Amount** and **Credit or Recovery** have been restated to reflect the new government structure. A reconciliation of these amounts by department is presented on page 33.

Definition of Terms:

Adjusted Gross Amount includes amounts voted in the 2006-07 Estimates, Supplementary Supply Estimates previously authorized by the *Appropriation (Supplementary Supply) Act, 2006 (No. 2),* an encumbrance pursuant to section 28(4) of the *Financial Administration Act,* changes in expense authorized by section 24(2) of the *Financial Administration Act,* for credit or recovery, and carry over of 2005-06 unused capital investment appropriations, pursuant to section 28.1 of the *Financial Administration Act.*

A Credit or Recovery of spending (expense, equipment / inventory purchases or capital investment) is shown for goods or services which are in variable demand, if their cost can be recovered from internal or external sources. During the fiscal year, Treasury Board may increase the Voted Estimate if spending and credits or recoveries are expected to exceed the amount budgeted, pursuant to section 24(2) of the *Financial Administration Act*. If the budgeted credits or recoveries are not realized, spending is to be reduced by an equivalent amount.

REASON SUPPLEMENTARY SUPPLY ESTIMATES REQUESTED

This Supplementary Amount of \$107,100,000 is requested for the estimated \$140,300,000 cost for the following programs, offset by a \$33,200,000 lapse in other programs:

- \$15,100,000 for additional apprenticeship technical training spaces;
- \$15,700,000 for nursing degree programs at Mount Royal College and Grant MacEwan College;
- \$900,000 for the development of social work, Cree language and Aboriginal artist programs at Blue Quills College;
- \$34,500,000 for a grant to match private donations to the University of Alberta and the University of Calgary;
- \$69,100,000 for Post-Secondary Facilities Infrastructure consisting of \$66,300,000 for capital projects at post-secondary institutions and \$2,800,000 for the WorldSkills Calgary 2009 Competition. Of this amount, \$47,300,000 will be funded from federal transfers;
- \$1,500,000 for enhancing science literary awareness programs at the Science Alberta Foundation;
- \$500,000 for enhancing awards and promoting the annual gala event at the ASTech Foundation; and
- \$3,000,000 for research and development at Genome Alberta related to mountain pine beetle infestations.

This Supplementary Amount of \$50,000,000 is requested to fund the Canadian Agricultural Income Stabilization (CAIS) Alberta Reference Margin Initiative. The CAIS Reference Margin Initiative, estimated at \$70,000,000, is partially offset by a \$20,000,000 reduction in CAIS funding resulting from the decision to treat federal Grains and Oilseeds Payment Program as eligible income within the CAIS program.

This Supplementary Amount of \$46,570,000 is requested for the \$47,070,000 cost of the following items:

- \$7,070,000 to reimburse public sector pension plans, research endowment funds, the Scholarship Fund and other minor funds for investment losses; and
- \$40,000,000 for a lump-sum payment for a portion of the government's share of the Management Employees Pension Plan unfunded pension liability.

Additional voted authority for this purpose is provided by a \$500,000 lapse in other programs.

REASON SUPPLEMENTARY SUPPLY ESTIMATES REQUESTED

This Supplementary Amount of \$42,846,000 is requested to provide:

- \$2,000,000 to fund up to 600 additional units under the Rent Supplement Program;
- \$15,173,000 for the Affordable Housing program to increase the availability of affordable housing units in the province. This spending would be offset by a transfer from the federal government;
- \$16,142,000 for the Off-Reserve Aboriginal Housing program to increase the availability of housing for Aboriginal Albertans living off-reserve. This spending would be offset by a transfer from the federal government; and
- \$9,531,000 to assist homeless or near-homeless people through outreach teams administered by seven major community-based organizations. The total cost of the pilot project is \$16,000,000. Balance of the funding of \$6,469,000 has been reallocated internally in Municipal Affairs and Housing.

Due to a decrease in anticipated natural gas rebates, the additional voted authority of \$102,475,000 approved in September 2006 remains unused. This amount is being reallocated as follows:

- \$11,161,000 is being provided for Regional Water System projects. The funding is required to enable municipalities to begin preliminary engineering work to develop regional water and wastewater systems.
- \$91,314,000 has been provided to support the Public Transit program. This program provides financial assistance to municipalities in support of sustainable municipal public transit infrastructure while protecting and improving the quality of our environment. The funding is provided by the federal government under the Public Transit Capital Trust.

Due to a reduction in fire hazard, voted authority of \$30,000,000 approved for firefighting remains unused. Of this amount, \$17,100,000 is being reallocated as follows:

- \$15,000,000 is being provided to continue ground survey and control operations to fight mountain pine beetle infestations and for grants to municipalities with infestations in their jurisdictions. The increased funding is required due to recent surveys indicating a significant increase in the number of infested trees, particularly in the Grande Prairie / Grande Cache area.
- \$2,100,000 has been provided to help address chronic wasting disease and to provide fencing, intercept feed and prevention materials required due to ungulate depredation.
