

Alberta Highlights

 Alberta's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 5.9 per cent in November 2023, up 0.1 percentage points from the previous month and up 0.2 percentage points from the same month last year (Chart 1).


Chart 1 Alberta Unemployment Rate

 Alberta's unemployment rate was the fifth lowest in Canada. The national unemployment rate at 5.8 per cent was 0.1 percentage points higher than the previous month (Chart 2).


Chart 2 Unemploment Rates by Province

- In November 2023, the labour force increased by 14,400 to 2,653,500. The number of labour force participants increased among 15 to 24 year olds (+12,000) and people aged 55 years and over (+13,800) and decreased for 25 to 54 year olds (-11,500).
- Month-over-month, employment increased by 8,900.
 Employment grew for 15 to 24 year olds and people aged 55 years and over and fell among 25 to 54 year olds.


- Month-over-month, employment increased in the public sector (+5,900) and in the private sector (+8,100) and decreased among the self-employed (-5,000). On a year-over-year basis, private sector employment grew by 76,000 and public sector employment increased by 28,500.
- Compared to the previous month, the seasonally adjusted three-month moving average for employment grew by 1,200 in Edmonton and shrunk by 9,300 in Calgary. It grew by 11,000 in the rest of Alberta.

 In November 2023, employment rose in seven out of 16 industries compared to the previous month. The industries with the most employment gains were: construction; public administration; and health care and social assistance (Chart 4).

 On a year-over-year basis, employment increased the most in: sales and service occupations; business, finance and administration occupations; and trades, transport and equipment operators and related occupations (Chart 5).


Chart 5 Year-over-Year Employment Growth By Occupation - Seasonally Unadjusted

 By economic regions, the seasonally unadjusted threemonth moving average unemployment rate was lowest in Camrose-Drumheller (2.5 per cent) and highest in Red Deer (7.9 per cent) (Figure 1).
