2. Industry's Growth:

- This industry accounted for 6.0% of total employment in Alberta in 2012.
- Employment in the Educational Services industry is expected to grow at an average rate of 1.5% from 2011 to 2015.
- The industry is expected to account for 6.2% of total employment in Alberta in 2015.

3. Facts, Trends and Outlook:

According to Statistics Canada's National Economic Accounts, the Educational Services industry accounted for 4.0% of Alberta's Gross Domestic Product in 2011, up slightly from 3.9% in 2001. The industry's share of Alberta's total employment decreased from 6.6% in 2002 to 6.0% in 2012.

Employment in 2012 was 1.2% higher than its level in 2011. For the last ten years, employment (the total number of employees and self-employed people) increased from 110,700 people in 2002 to 128,900 people in 2012, a 16.4% increase. There were 122,100 employees in the industry in 2012 of whom 78.5% were permanent and 21.5% were temporary. Self-employed people accounted for 5.3% of total employment in the industry in 2012.

Note: The percentage of multiple jobholders in Alberta is obtained by dividing the number of multiple jobholders in Alberta by total employment in Alberta. The percentage of multiple jobholders in the industry is obtained by dividing the number of multiple jobholders in the industry by total employment in the industry. This calculation method also applies to the percentage of employees under union coverage and the percentage of employees working overtime per week.

According to *Alberta Occupational Demand Outlook 2012-2016*⁶, employment growth in the following occupations is expected to be below 2.4%, the average for all occupations: University professors and assistants; College and other vocational instructors; and Secondary and elementary school teachers and educational counsellors.

Note: Statistics Canada's survey methodology for determining establishment size differs from the one it uses in the Labour Force Survey to determine total employment. As a result, the total number of employees by establishment size will not be the same as total employment in the industry, except by coincidence.

2. Demographics: Gender and Age:

According to the Labour Force Survey, the gender breakdown in the Educational Services industry in 2012 was as follows:

- women employed: 85,900 people, or 66.6%
- men employed: 43,000 people, or 33.4%

In Alberta, women accounted for 44.8% and men made up 55.2% of total employment.


