## Early Childhood Services 1. Age of Eligibility

## **Background**

Early childhood services (ECS) program means an education program offered by a school authority or, with the approval of the Minister, a person, to a child who is younger than 6 years of age as of September 1, School Act, s30(1). The last year of an ECS program prior to Grade 1 is considered the kindergarten year.

## Age of Eligibility

The following table outlines the age of eligibility for funding for all types of ECS programming. No child can receive ECS funding for more than three years. Detailed information is located in the current <u>Funding Manual for School Authorities</u>.

<ul> <li>ECS child learning English as a Second Language (ESL)</li> <li>a child who is assessed as having insufficient English language skills to succeed in school.</li> <li>ECS child with Francisation needs</li> <li>a child who is attending a Francophone program and is assessed and coded as having insufficient French language skills to succeed in school.</li> <li>Please see the current Funding Manual for School Authorities for further information.</li> </ul>	Base Instruction (Maximum 2 years funding).  ESL/Francisation and if eligible, Enhanced ESL/Francisation	3 years 6 months
ECS child with severe disabilities/delays a child who is assessed and coded as having a severe disability/delay according to the criteria and categories set out in the current Special Education Coding Criteria. <ul> <li>a child who is <u>developmentally immature</u></li> <li>a child who is enrolled in an ECS program for a second year because the parent and the school authority agree that an ECS program is the most appropriate placement for the child. The child is less than seven years old on September 1 and has not been previously coded as a child with special needs.</li> <li>Please see the current <u>Funding Manual for School Authorities</u> for further information.</li> </ul>	Base Instruction (Maximum 2 years funding)	5 years 6 months

The minimum age for school entry varies among school authorities. ECS children who meet the age requirement listed on the table are eligible for ECS Base Instruction funding if registered on or before September 30. Care should be taken to ensure that school entry into Grade 1 will follow the final year of eligibility for ECS funding.
