Alberta Indian Tax Exemption (AITE) Special Notice Vol. 4 No. 18 Expiry Dates of Active AITE Cards

Issued: August 25, 2020

NOTE: This special notice is intended to explain legislation and provide specific information. Every effort has been made to ensure the contents are accurate. However, if a discrepancy should occur in interpretation between this special notice and governing legislation, the legislation takes precedence.

The Government of Alberta recognizes that many First Nations people and communities in the province prefer not to describe themselves as Indians and bands. These terms have been used where necessary to reflect their legal meanings in the federal Indian Act.

Further to the information provided in <u>Special Notice Vol. 4 No. 17</u>, active AITE cards with expiry dates on or after January 1, 2020 are extended indefinitely. In an effort to reduce administrative burden as part of the Government of Alberta's commitment to reduce red tape, TRA will no longer be renewing active AITE cards. However, TRA will continue to process applications and issue AITE cards for newly eligible individuals, and will process applications for replacement cards in the event an active AITE card is lost or damaged.

Individuals and bands requiring a new or replacement AITE card should apply to TRA, which will issue the AITE card as soon as possible.
