Medicine Hat has, at present, a large variety of industrial sites from private and municipal—owned sources. Most parcels are in, or are planned as, industrial parks with full services. There are approximately 647 hectares (1,600 acres) of land in reserve for future industrial use, mostly located in the heavily industrialized northwest sector of the city. This area, known as Brier industrial Estates, has approximately 28 hectares (70 acres) and 16 hectares (40 acres) of light and heavy industrial land respectively in lot sizes from .4 hectare to 4 hectares (1 acre to 10 acres). Large complexes requiring extensive acreages can be accommodated in the reserve lands to the north of the existing industrial subdivisions. Also in the northwest sector is a privately—owned industrial subdivision available on a lease basis only to smaller industry and service oriented companies. Trackage is available to many lots.

The other major industrial area in Medicine Hat is located in the southwest next to the municipal airport. There are 12 hectares (30 acres) municipal-owned land available with full services 16 hectares (plus 40 acres) in reserve and 10 hectares (25 acres) of privately owned land with partial services. No trackage available.

Current buildings are the metal clad Knight Schmidt building with 8,489 square metres (91,377 square feet) which includes a 334 square metre (3,600 square feet) office under one roof, two concrete tilt-up warehouses of 3,553 square metres (38,254 square feet) which includes a 55.7 square metre (600 square feet) office, Medalta warehouses at approximately 2,787 square metres (30,000 square feet), Medicine Hat Implements at 557 square metres (6,000 square feet) and other warehouse/shop bays of 92.9 square metres (1,000 square feet) to 232 square metres (2,500 square feet) each. The availability of space is changeable and the City of Medicine Hat Economic Development Manager should be contacted for updates as the situation requires.

Brief History -

In 1847, a detachment of North West Mounted Police built a barracks on the South Saskatchewan River; an area that is now known as Police Point in northeast Medicine Hat.

Medicine Hat had its true origin with the extension of the Canadian Pacific Railway which reached the community in 1883. It was incorporated as a town in 1899 and by 1907 was formally incorporated as a city. Between 1907 and 1914, the city expanded quickly until World War I slowed its growth. In recent years, however, its population has shown a steady and rapid climb, rising from 9,529 in 1940 to 41,493 with the 1984 annexation.

In 1883, when the C.P.R. work gang was drilling for water, gas was discovered. In 1901, the City set up a municipal gas system and in 1903 interested itself in drilling a test well, resulting in an enormous supply of dry gas being found at a depth of 305 metres (1,000 feet). This resource has proven to be the main attraction to industry, which was not slow in taking advantage of a cheap source of fuel. Initially, rolling mills, tent and awning factories, foundries and clay products plants were established. Alberta Linseed Oil, IXL Industries and the Crane Canada Foundry are some of the remaining examples. Flour milling also started with one of the four original mills currently operating.

In 1956, Northwest Nitro Chemicals led the way in an industrial expansion that is still ongoing. The variety of economic activity in the community is its heart and Medicine Hat shows every sign of good economic health now and in the future.
