# Section 2: Outbreaks


There are eight new outbreaks to report this week. Including the outbreaks reported in week 52 there have been 36 influenza outbreaks this season.

#### Section 3: Isolates

In the 2012/13 influenza season, the Provincial Laboratory for Public Health (PLPH) has reported 801 Influenza A cases and 56 Influenza B cases to Alberta Health. In week 52 there were 159\* lab confirmed influenza cases reported to Alberta Health.



Sentinel physicians report cases of ILI seen in their practices. 23 cases of influenza like illness (ILI) were seen in week 52.

### Section 7: Antiviral Resistance

- There have been no influenza isolates identified that are resistant to amantadine, zanamivir or oseltamivir in the 2012/13 influenza season.
- In the 2011/12 season there were 10 isolates that were resistant to amantadine and no isolates were resistant to zanamivir or oseltamivir.
