

#### Section 3: Isolates

Thus far in the 2012/13 influenza season, the Provincial Laboratory for Public Health (PLPH) has confirmed 7 Influenza A isolates and no Influenza B isolates. Six isolates are from the Edmonton Zone and one is from the Calgary Zone. Three of the cases are typed as H3, and the remaining four are H1N1 PDM09.
