### Section 2: Outbreaks


There are 13 new influenza outbreaks to report this week. There were a total of 10 outbreaks in week 1. Including the outbreaks reported this week there have been 60 influenza outbreaks this season.


#### Section 3: Isolates

In the 2012/13 influenza season, the Provincial Laboratory for Public Health (PLPH) has reported 1433 Influenza A cases and 89 Influenza B cases to Alberta Health. In week 1 there were 221 lab confirmed influenza cases reported to Alberta Health, and in week 2 there were 280\* lab confirmed influenza cases reported to Alberta Health.



# Section 4: Hospitalizations

There were 92\* new hospitalized cases of influenza reported in week 2, and 55 confirmed hospitalized cases in week 1. There have been 366 hospitalized cases in total for this influenza season.

### Section 5: Influenza-Like Illness - TARRANT-Week 2

Sentinel physicians report cases of ILI seen in their practices. 29 cases of influenza like illness (ILI) were seen in week 1 and 49 cases of influenza like illness (ILI) were seen in week 2.

# Section 7: Antiviral Resistance

- There have been no influenza isolates identified that are resistant to amantadine, zanamivir or oseltamivir in the 2012/13 influenza season.
- In the 2011/12 season there were 10 isolates that were resistant to amantadine and no isolates were resistant to zanamivir or oseltamivir.
