Using the Standardized Terms of Reference

The following explains how the sectors are classified:

- In-situ applies to all types of in-situ projects. If the project also involves an upgrader appropriate clauses from the Industrial Plant TORs will be added
- Oil Sands Mine applies to mines with and without upgraders
- Coal Mine applies to coal mines and mines with a coal processing plant. If the project includes another type of plant (e.g., coal-fired power plant, coal gasification plant) appropriate clauses from the Industrial Plant TORs will be added. The Coal Mine TORs, with appropriate modifications, will also apply to quarries
- Industrial Plant applies to a variety of industrial plants (e.g., petrochemical, upgraders, power plants)

Proponents should review the <u>Guide to</u>
<u>Preparing Environmental Impact Assessment</u>
<u>Reports in Alberta</u> when preparing their
Environmental Impact Assessment Report. The
Guide contains additional information
requirements and instructions on Study Areas,
report content and cumulative effects
assessment.
