

COVID-19 LTC, DSL & HOSPICE DAILY CHECKLIST

Staff, Service Providers, Students and Volunteers

Overview

This tool was developed to support continuing care sites and reduce the risk of transmission of COVID-19. **Staff, Service Providers, Students and Volunteers** are required to complete this checklist before entering a long-term care, designated supportive living and hospice settings.

Any person who is a confirmed case of COVID-19 must not enter the site and must follow isolation requirements as per [CMOH Order 02-2022](#).

1.	Have you traveled outside Canada in the last 14 days AND have you been directed to quarantine?	YES	NO		
<p>If you answered "YES":</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Do not enter the site unless you have an authorized exemption from quarantine. Please see the Government of Canada Travel, Testing, Quarantine and Borders for more information regarding quarantine requirements, <p>If you answered "NO", proceed to question 2.</p>					
2.	<p>Have you had any known close contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19 in the last 14 days?</p> <p>Close Contact - means a person who: without the consistent and appropriate use of personal protective equipment, provides care to, lives with, or has close physical contact with, a person who is a confirmed case of COVID-19; or has come into contact with the infectious body fluids of a person who is a confirmed case of COVID-19.</p> <p>Confirmed case- means a person who has had a positive result on a COVID-19 test that confirms the person is infected with COVID-19. Tests can be rapid test or lab-based PCR tests.</p>	YES	NO		
<p>If you answered "YES":</p> <table border="1"> <tr> <td> <p>Fully Immunized¹:</p> <p>With a negative rapid screening test, proceed to question 3.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Daily rapid testing is <u>required</u> prior to each shift for 10 days following exposure. Day 11-14, no rapid test is required however staff must monitor closely for any symptoms. Those newly recovered from COVID-19, are not required to rapid test for 21 days following the completion of their isolation period. </td> <td> <p><u>NOT</u> Fully Immunized¹:</p> <p>Do not enter the site for 14 days from the last day of exposure.</p> </td> </tr> </table> <p>If you answered "NO", proceed to question 3.</p>				<p>Fully Immunized¹:</p> <p>With a negative rapid screening test, proceed to question 3.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Daily rapid testing is <u>required</u> prior to each shift for 10 days following exposure. Day 11-14, no rapid test is required however staff must monitor closely for any symptoms. Those newly recovered from COVID-19, are not required to rapid test for 21 days following the completion of their isolation period. 	<p><u>NOT</u> Fully Immunized¹:</p> <p>Do not enter the site for 14 days from the last day of exposure.</p>
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¹ A fully immunized person who has received the complete vaccine series for COVID-19 and it has been 14 days after the second dose in a two dose series or one dose in a one dose series (e.g. Janssen). If you do not meet this criteria, you are considered NOT fully immunized.

<p>If you answered “YES” to any symptom in question 3:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Stay home or return home. Do not enter the site Use the AHS Online Assessment Tool or call Health Link 811 to receive additional information on testing and isolation. Individuals with fever, cough, shortness of breath, runny nose, sore throat or loss of sense of taste or smell are required to isolate for 5 days if they are fully immunized¹ and if they are NOT fully immunized¹, they are required to isolate for 10 days as per the current CMOH Order OR receive a negative COVID-19 test and feel better before returning to activities, as long as they have no known exposure. <p>If you answered “NO”:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You may enter the site.
