COVID-19 CONTINUING CARE DAILY CHECKLIST Visitors

Overview

This tool was developed to support continuing care sites and reduce the risk of transmission of COVID-19. **Visitors** are required to complete this checklist before entering the continuing care site. Children may need a parent or guardian to assist them to complete this screening tool.

Any person who is a confirmed case of COVID-19, or has been tested for COVID-19 and is awaiting the results, must not enter the site and must follow isolation requirements as per CMOH Order 02-2022.

Confirmed case- means a person who has had a positive result on a COVID-19 test that confirms the person is infected with COVID-19. Tests can be rapid test or lab-

If you answered "YES" to any symptom in question 3:

- Stay home or return home. Do not enter the site
- Use the <u>AHS Online Assessment Tool</u> or call Health Link 811 to receive additional information on testing and isolation.
- Individuals with fever, cough, shortness of breath, runny nose, sore throat or loss of sense of taste
 or smell are required to isolate for 5 days if they are fully immunized¹ and if they are NOT fully
 immunized¹, they are required to isolate for 10 days as per the current <u>CMOH Order</u> OR <u>receive a</u>
 <u>negative COVID-19 test</u> and feel better before returning to activities, as long as they have no known
 exposure.
- If your child is experiencing any symptoms from the list above, do not bring them to visit the facility for 10 days from when symptoms started or until symptoms resolve (whichever is longer), unless they receive a negative COVID-19 test result and feel better.

If you answered "NO":

You may enter the site.

¹ A fully immunized person who has received the complete vaccine series for COVID-19 and it has been 14 days after the second dose in a two dose series or one dose in a one dose series (e.g. Janssen). If you do not meet this criteria, you are considered NOT fully immunized.
