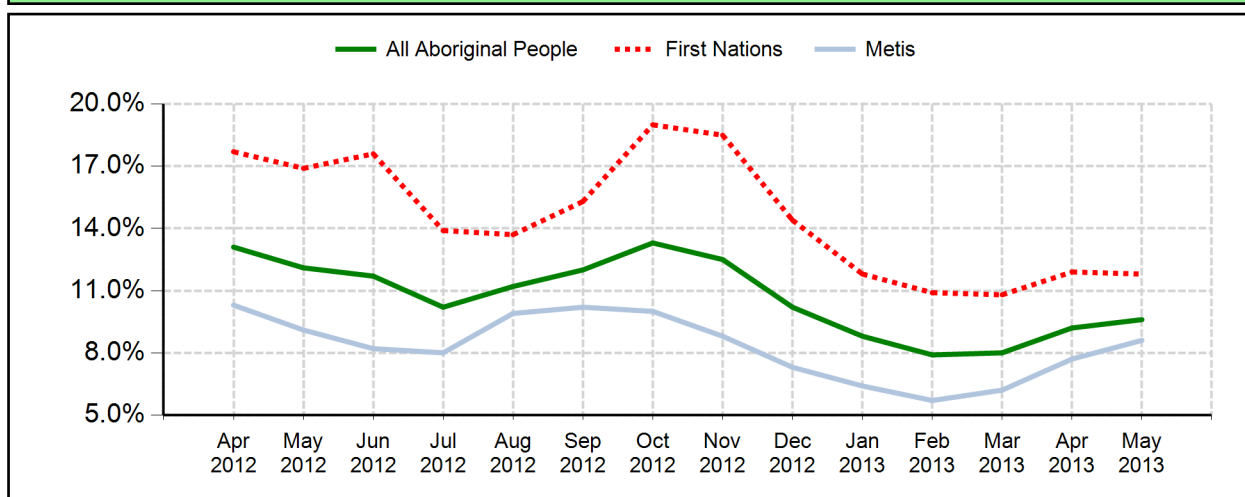

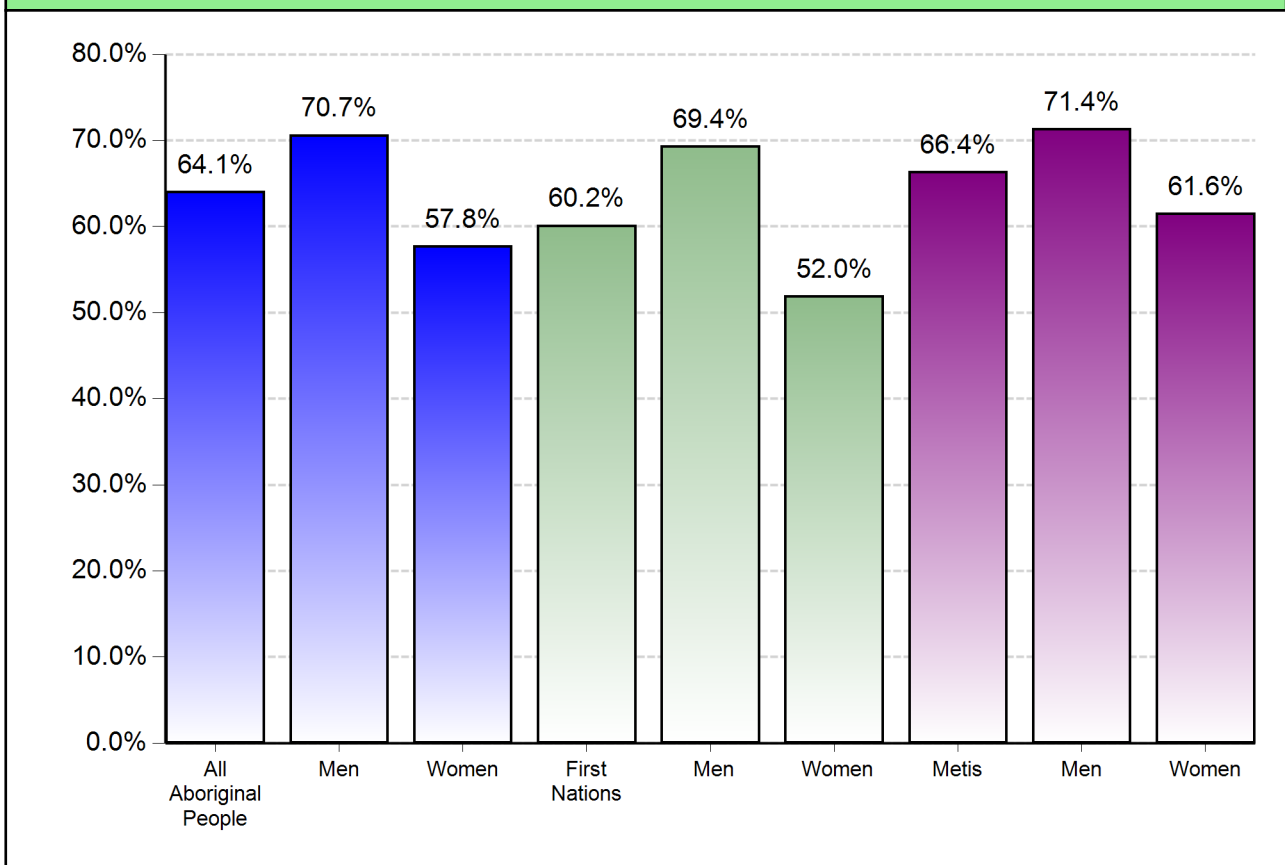

*May 2013, Unadjusted, 3-Month Moving Average*



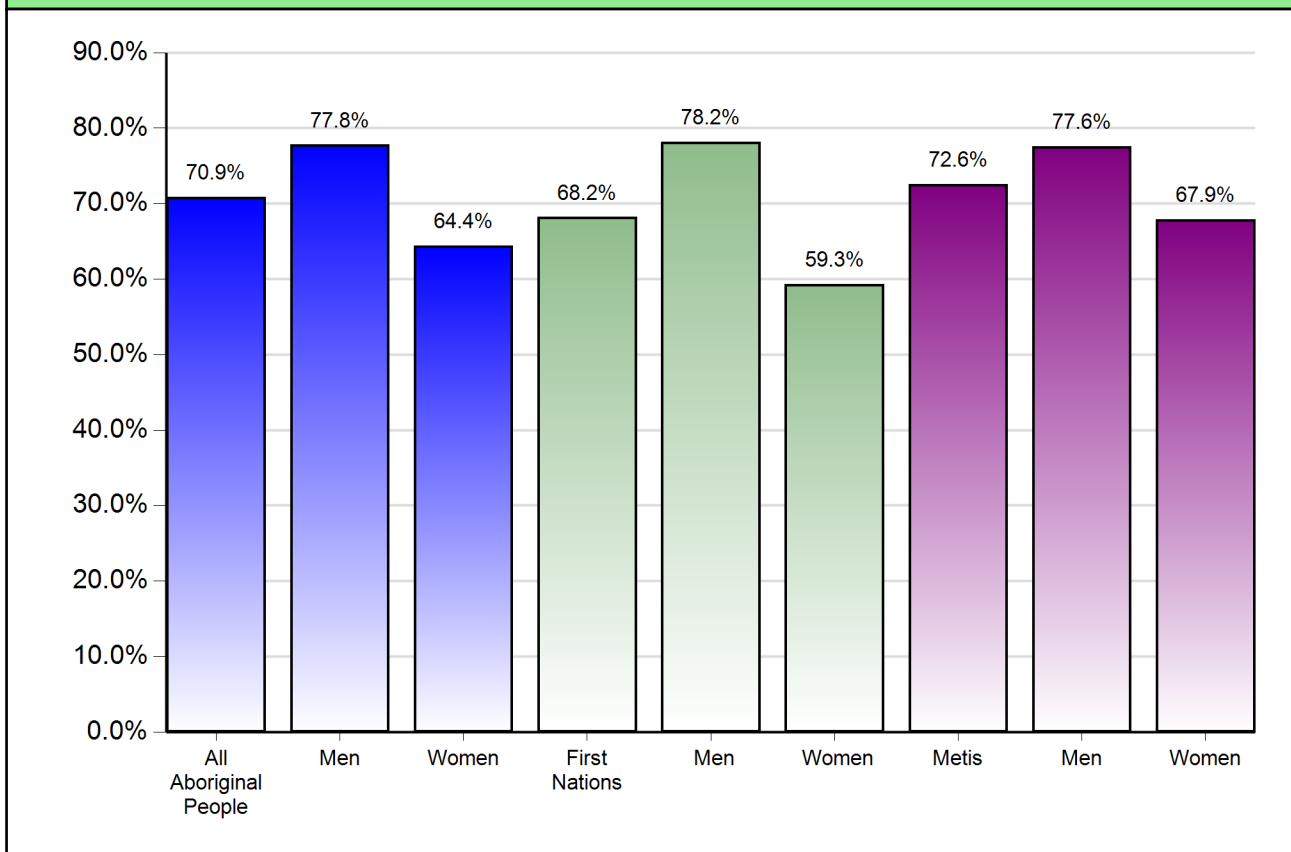

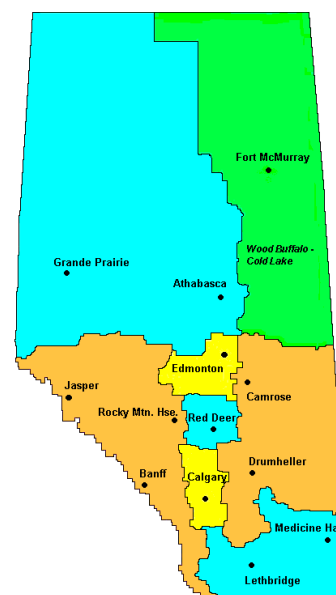
