Program Description:

This program provides persons with disabilities with career information and employment placement services.

- Level 1 services - Any client with a self-disclosed disability may access career information services through the resource centre on a drop-in basis.
- Level 2 services - Clients who demonstrate employment capacity, who have a documented disability and who are ready, willing and able to work may access job placement services.
- Level 3 services - Persons with a developmental disability (both PDD eligible and not eligible) may access supports (workshops) over a 32-week period.

This program provides career and employment information services and job placement for persons with disabilities in the Edmonton Region.

First Level Services: Clients who have barriers due to an identifiable, self-disclosed, or documented disability that is interfering with their ability to reach an employment goal can receive assistance through the Employment Resource Centre.

Second Level Services: Clients who demonstrate employment capacity, have an identifiable or documented chronic or permanent disability with a reduction of functional capacity or activity due to an impairment in the person's mental or physical structure or functioning, and who are ready, willing and able to work may access job placement services.
