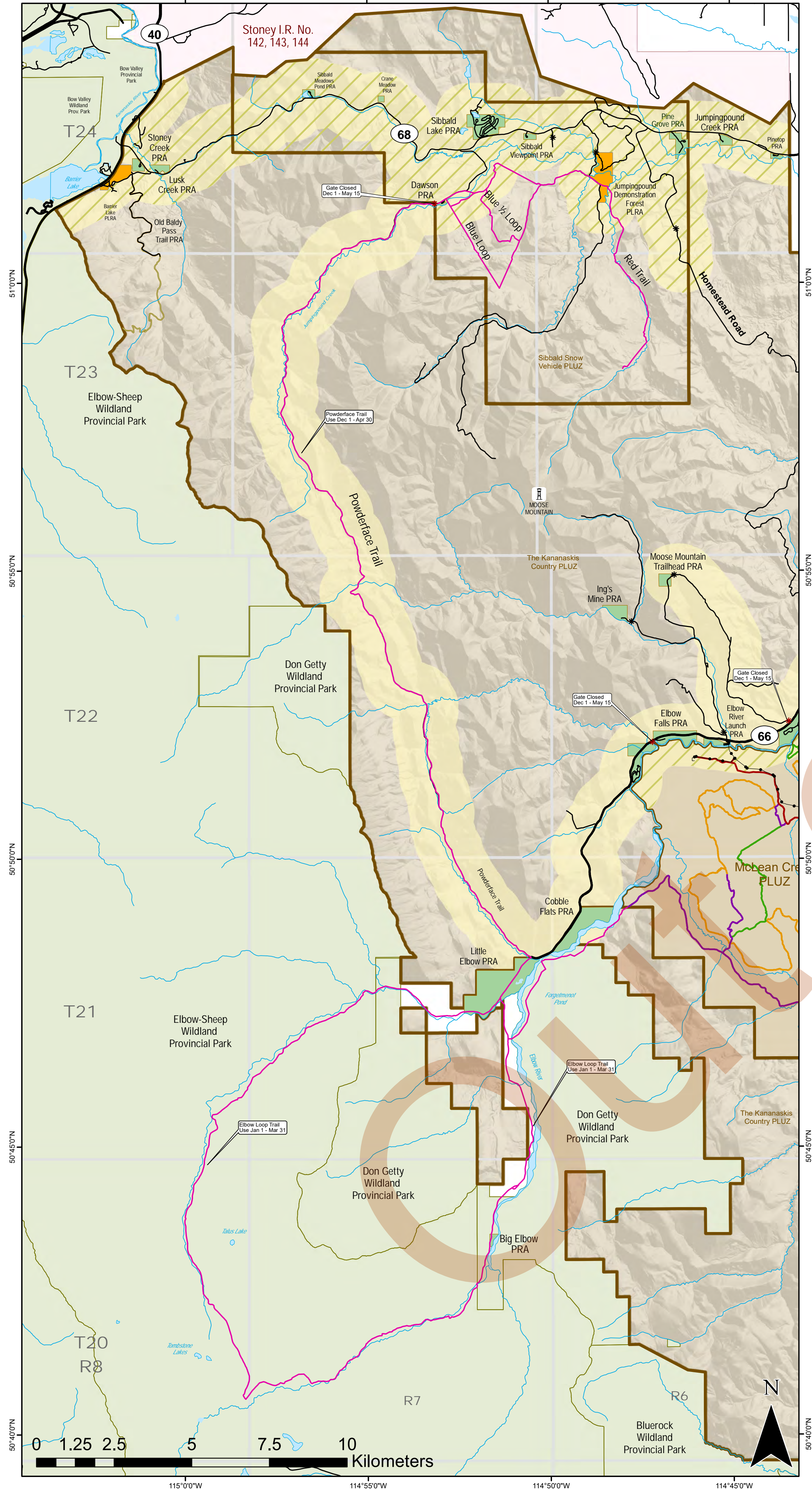

#### Sibbald and Cataract Creek Public Land Use Zone & Elbow Loop Public Recreation Trail

1. Travel is restricted to snow vehicles. All other OHVs are prohibited.
2. Travel is permitted on designated snow vehicle trails only.
3. Elbow Loop Public Recreation Trail is open Jan. 1 to Mar. 31.
4. Periodic trail closures may be in effect due to poor snow or avalanche conditions.
5. For your own safety, no stopping in posted avalanche areas.
