

New: Oil Prices


WTI decreased \$4.54 over the week and closed at US\$78.28 on Thursday. The WTI-WCS differential closed at US\$15.40 per barrel, wider than a week ago.



Labour Market


Employment increased by 8,100 in June. Compared to a year ago, it was up by 67,100. The next release is on August 09, 2024.





The Alberta Activity Index advanced in April (+2.7% monthover-month), and was up 3.8% from a year ago. Alberta's real GDP by industry increased by 1.5% in 2023, following 5.3% growth in 2022.



Manufacturing Shipments


Manufacturing shipments increased 0.9% m/m to \$8.7 billion in May. They were up 0.5% from a year ago.

Merchandise Exports

Alberta goods exports increased 0.3% m/m in May to \$16.1 billion. They were up 12% from a year ago.

Year-over-year % change




Rigs Drilling

The number of rigs drilling in Alberta averaged 117 in June, down 1.1% from a year ago.

Wholesale Trade³

Wholesale trade decreased 1.2% m/m to \$9.2 billion in May. Compared to a year ago, sales were down 6.7%.

Population Growth

Alberta's population was 4,849,906 as of April 1, 2024, an increase of 4.4% from the year prior. During the last 12 months, Alberta welcomed 134,513 net international migrants and saw a net inflow of 53,415 interprovincial migrants.


Housing Starts

Alberta housing starts fell 12% m/m in June to 42,271 units (SAAR). They were up 58% from a year ago.

Resale Housing

The number of home sales in the resale market increased 1.4% m/m to 6,984 units in June, up 3.2% y/y.

Average weekly earnings in Alberta rose 1.2% to \$1,334 in May. They were up 3.7% year-over-year.

Inflation


The consumer price index in Alberta increased 3.0% y/y in June, unchanged from 3.0% y/y in May.

Alberta's retail sales decreased 2.5% m/m to \$8.5 billion in May. Compared to a year ago, sales were down 1.8%.


RETAIL SALES, CONSUMER PRICES, AND EARNINGS

Year-over-year % change






UNEMPLOYMENT RATE




AVERAGE WEEKLY EARNINGS

(May 2024, year-over-year growth)




CPI INFLATION

(June 2024, year-over-year growth)






(June 2024, year-over-year growth)
