

## **New: Oil Prices**

WTI decreased \$2.36 over the week and closed at US\$75.55 on Thursday. The WTI-WCS differential closed at US\$13.05 per barrel, wider than a week ago.



## **New: Labour Market**

Employment decreased by 20,400 in May. Compared to a year ago, it was up by 65,800. The next release is on July 05, 2024.

## **New: Economic Activity**

The Alberta Activity Index declined in March (-1.0% monthover-month), and was up 0.5% from a year ago. Alberta's real GDP by industry increased by 1.5% in 2023, following 5.3% growth in 2022.

Year-over-year % change



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## **Manufacturing Shipments**


Manufacturing shipments decreased 5.3% m/m to \$8.3 billion in March. They were down 3.6% from a year ago.

## **New: Merchandise Exports**

Alberta goods exports increased 9.2% m/m in April to \$15.6 billion. They were up 18% from a year ago.

Year-over-year % change




## **New:** Rigs Drilling

The number of rigs drilling in Alberta averaged 93 in May, up 19% from a year ago.

## Wholesale Trade<sup>3</sup>

Wholesale trade decreased 1.5% m/m to \$9.0 billion in March. Compared to a year ago, sales were down 4.8%.

## **Population Growth**

Alberta's population was 4,800,768 as of January 1, 2024, an increase of 4.4% from the year prior. During the last 12 months, Alberta welcomed 130,870 net international migrants and saw a net inflow of 55,107 interprovincial migrants.

## **Housing Starts**

Alberta housing starts increased 15% m/m in April to 45,910 units (SAAR). They were up 68% from a year ago.

## **Resale Housing**

The number of home sales in the resale market was down 4.5% m/m to 6,732 units in April but was up 12% y/y.

## **Average Weekly Earnings**

Average weekly earnings in Alberta rose 0.3% to \$1,299 in March. They were up 2.2% year-over-year.

## Inflation

The consumer price index in Alberta increased 3.0% y/y in April, down from 3.5% y/y in March.

## **Retail Sales**

Alberta's retail sales decreased 0.3% m/m to \$8.4 billion in March. Compared to a year ago, sales were down 0.4%.


#### **RETAIL SALES, CONSUMER PRICES, AND EARNINGS**

Year-over-year % change






#### UNEMPLOYMENT RATE




#### AVERAGE WEEKLY EARNINGS

(March 2024, year-over-year growth)





#### **CPI INFLATION**

(April 2024, year-over-year growth)




