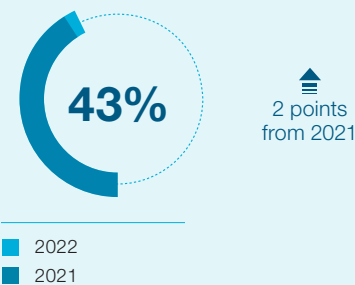

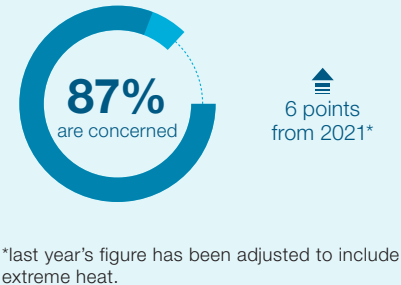

Reasons for not being prepared include:

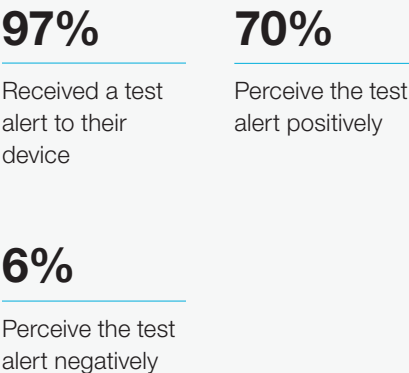
- Need more information

All  indicate percentage point change from 2021

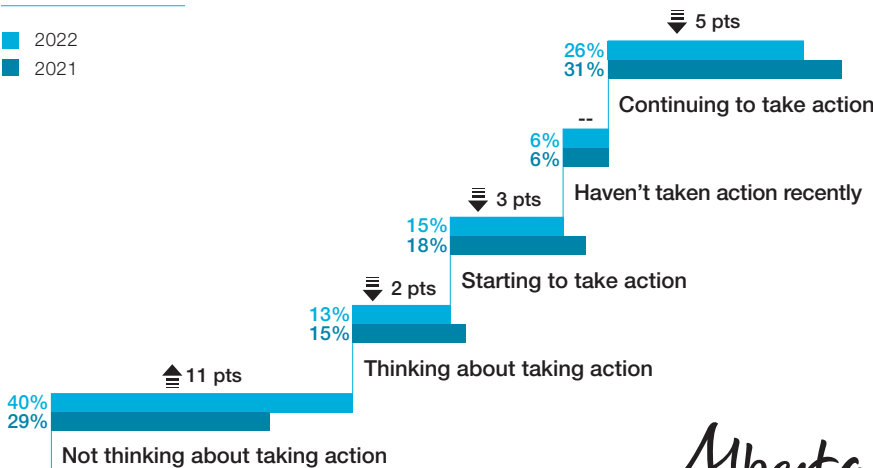
