Notes

- Information has been sourced from Foundation Directory Online ("FDO"). FDO provides a summary of grants reported in IRS filings for US charitable organizations for the period 2003 to 2019. Based on our limited review, Deloitte has identified grants totaling between \$37.5 million and \$58.9 million both directly and indirectly related to the Alberta Resource Development Opposition Campaign. Deloitte has not adjusted any grant details provided by FDO (grant maker names, recipient names, grant descriptions, etc.). Grant amounts have been converted to Canadian dollars using the Bank of Canada's average annual exchange rates.
- Grants directly related to the Alberta Resource Development Opposition Campaign comprise grants where the grant description specifically noted the words/phrases outlined in Schedule 10.1. Grants descriptions were further reviewed to assess direct relation to Alberta Resource Development Opposition campaign. Grants identified that were not directly related to the Alberta Resource Development Opposition Campaign are considered indirectly related and are reflected in Schedule 10.2.
- Grants indirectly related to the Alberta Resource Development Opposition Campaign comprise grants with a more generic reference including grants with multi-purpose descriptions and organizations known to have participated in the Alberta Resource Development Opposition Campaign. More over, the recipients of such grants were generally located in the United States.
- Certain Recipients received grants both directly and indirectly related to the Alberta Resource Development Opposition Campaign. Refer to Schedules 10.1 and 10.2 for a detailed list of recipients by country.

Grants indirectly related to Alberta Resource Development Opposition comprise grants with a more generic description including grants with multi-purpose descriptions and organizations known to have participated in Alberta Resource Development Opposition.

For example, the grant description identified containing the key word Tar Sands was "To research and reduce short-lived climate forcers (SLCFs) as a strategy for buffering the effects of climate change caused by current CO2 emissions. CATF will focus on the following areas of research and advocacy: 1) reducing global methane that will result in emissions savings of over 1 gigaton of CO2; 2) a campaign to reduce agricultural burning in countries in northern latitudes; 3) compiling a paper on carbon black and methane emissions from tar sands operations; and 4) expanding US domestic action to reduce SLCFs"
