







Casualty Rates per 10,000 Population








The Alberta seat belt wearing rate was 95.1% in 2011*

Speeding Increases Collision Severity


1 in 4 drivers in fatal collisions (23.8%) and 1 in 10 drivers in injury crashes (7.7%) were driving at an unsafe speed


Involvement Rates per 1,000 Licensed Drivers Show...
