Elk Run Industrial - Business Park

Located adjacent to both the TransCanada Highway and Highway 1A, it offers fully serviced lots in Phase I, ranging from .2 ha to 1.4 ha (.52 acres to 3.5 acres). Phase II of development consisting of an additional 34 ha (84 acres) offers a selection of sites with superb highway exposure. Land prices are negotiable and interested parties are encouraged to contact the town of Canmore directly.

Industrial Buildings/Warehousing

A 1300 m² (14,000 sq. ft.) building on 3.2 ha (2 acres) of land is available for lease or purchase. This property also features second floor space of about 650 m² (7,000 sq. ft.). Site is zoned industrial and ideal for a light manufacturing enterprise.

Aspen industrial Park also offers warehousing and industrial space opportunities. Approximately 371 m² to 557 m² (4,000 sq. ft to 6,000 sq. ft.) of bay space is available to prospective businesses.

There is also a good supply of commercial retail space available in the Canmore downtown district ranging from 37 m^2 (400 sq. ft.) and upwards.

Brief History -

Industrialism, for which the Bow Valley would become notable, had already begun when the Canadian Pacific Railway arrived. The growth of Calgary spawned a large demand for lumber, and in 1883 the Eau Claire Lumber Company obtained timber rights and a mill was operated near Canmore until 1886. Lime quarries were developed in the area as early as 1888. In 1908 the CPR developed a cement plant near Exhsaw. Through the years the coal mining industry was the mainstay of Canmore's economy. In 1979 the last load of coal was shipped from Canmore.

A new era began. Canmore's new opportunity to develop as a tourist destination and service centre for Kananaskis Country and Banff National Park commenced in one of North American's most spectacular areas, the magificent Canadian Rockies.

Canmore has also been selected as the site of the Calgary 1988 Olympic Games cross country, nordic combined and biathlon events. The Canmore Nordic Centre built for the Games competitions features stadium facilities, shooting range, 63 km (38.5 miles) of competitive, training and recreational trails linking the centre with Canmore and Banff National Park.

Located in a year round recreational paradise in the Rocky Mountains, Canmore is waiting for you to come and explore the superlative recreational opportunities.
