

Labour Force Statistics Aboriginal People (Off-Reserve) September 2012

Alberta Aboriginal People Highlights:

- The unadjusted three-month moving average unemployment rate for Aboriginal people living off-reserve rose 0.8 percentage points in September 2012 to 12.0%, compared to the previous month.
- The labour force increased by 1,800 and employment rose by 900 between August and September 2012.
- Full-time employment increased by 700 and part-time employment by 300 from the month before.
- In September 2012, the unemployment rate for Aboriginal men increased to 9.7% from 9.1% in August; and for Aboriginal women, it rose to 14.5% from 13.7% between August and September 2012.
- The three occupations with largest increases in employment from twelve months ago were: Trades, transportation, operators and related, 4,700; Occupations unique to primary industry, 2,100; and Management occupations, 1,700.
