

Labour Force Statistics Aboriginal People (Off-Reserve) July 2012

Alberta Aboriginal People Highlights:

- The unadjusted three-month moving average unemployment rate for Aboriginal people living off-reserve fell 1.5 percentage points in July 2012 to 10.2%, compared to the previous month.
- The labour force increased by 1,700 and employment increased by 2,800 from June to July 2012.
- Full-time employment increased by 2,900 and part-time employment decreased by 100, from the month before.
- The unemployment rate decreased for Aboriginal men from 10.6% in June to 8.6% in July, and for Aboriginal women, it decreased from 13.1% to 12.1% between June and July 2012.
- The four industries with largest increases in employment from twelve months ago were: Construction, 3,700; Health Care and social Assistance, 3,000; Retail and Wholesale Trade, 1,900; and Transportation and Warehousing, 1,600.
