

Labour Force Statistics Aboriginal People (Off-Reserve) June 2012

Alberta Aboriginal People Highlights:

- The unadjusted three-month moving average unemployment rate for Aboriginal people living off-reserve fell 0.4 percentage points in June 2012 to 11.7%, compared to the previous month.
- The labour force increased by 900 and employment increased by 1,200 from May to June 2012.
- Full-time employment increased by 1,400 and part-time employment decreased by 200, from the month before.
- The unemployment rate for Aboriginal men decreased to 10.6% in June 2012 from 12.1% in May 2012.
- The four industries with increases in employment from the previous month were: Construction, 1,300; Retail and Wholesale Trade, 1,300; Management, Administrative and Other Support, 400; and Information, Culture and Recreation, 400.
