Minister's Dialogue with the Arts Sector Executive Summary

Between December 16, 2009, and February 26, 2010, the Honourable Lindsay Blackett, Minister of Culture and Community Spirit engaged in a dialogue with the arts sector in Alberta. Six regional dialogue meetings were conducted in Fort McMurray, Grande Prairie, Lethbridge, Calgary, Red Deer and Edmonton. An online dialogue was hosted on the Culture and Community Spirit website to enable access to individuals who wished to have input but were not able to participate in the regional dialogues. The purpose of the dialogue was to identify challenges and opportunities for government and the sector to work better together to help support healthy and vibrant communities.

A total of 120 people from the arts sector attended the regional dialogues and over 150 participated in the online dialogue. Several key themes emerged and were repeated throughout the Minister's Dialogue:

- General Perceptions on the State of the Arts: The talent of artists and depth of the
 talent pool in Alberta are world class. Albertans need to recognize the economic impact
 and potential of the creative industries. The arts are essential to attracting and retaining
 the skilled and knowledgeable people needed for the continued economic sustainability
 and quality of life of our province.
- **Promoting the Value of the Arts Sector:** The sector, in partnership with the Government of Alberta, can identify and communicate information about the value of the arts to Albertans, focusing on both economic impact and quality-of-life benefits.
- Funding Challenges: Access to predictable public and private funding sufficient to support sector sustainability was identified as a challenge. Stakeholders expressed difficulty in soliciting funding from non-public sources such as the corporate community during the current economic conditions.
- **Facilities Needs:** Arts organizations are challenged by high usage costs for, and limited access to, performance, practice and administrative facility space.
- A Province-Wide Arts 'Voice': Participants see a need for the development of both a
 province-wide arts advocacy group and a central communication model for arts
 promotion and networking for arts and culture organizations.
- Human Resources: Ability to attract and retain workers, volunteers and local artists is an ongoing concern. Limited access to professional development opportunities for administrative staff and local artists was raised.
- Reaching Young Albertans: The importance of the arts in the school curriculum was
 discussed, in terms of developing creative and analytical thinkers as well as developing
 appreciation of the role of the arts in society. Difficulty exists in attracting youth interest
 and participation in the arts, particularly as volunteers.

Participants expressed appreciation for the Minister's demonstrated commitment to supporting and promoting the arts. Participants in both the regional dialogues and the online dialogue identified that Alberta's arts sector is characterized by passionate, committed and talented individuals that meet sector challenges with innovation, collaboration and resourcefulness.

Participant Comments: Fort McMurray – December 16, 2009

Capacity Challenges of Sector Organizations

- Enhanced costs due to geographic location—i.e. transportation, supply costs
- · Costs for and limited access to facility space
- Desire for more and longer term access to facility space; i.e., a cooperative arts facility
- Access to arts programming geographic and communication challenges
- Access to professional development opportunities for local artists

Human Resources Challenges of Sector Organizations

- Relatively transient population leads to a difficulty in staff, volunteer and client retention
- Difficulty in retaining local artists

Community Challenges of Sector Organizations

- Area lacks a central board/organization to communicate about arts and culture in the community
- Faces a challenge in a northern climate in terms of attracting attendance to events

Capacity Challenges of Sector Organizations

- Enhanced costs due to geographic location— i.e. transportation, supply costs
- Access to professional development opportunities for local artists
- Communicating importance of arts programming to community interests

Funding Challenges of Sector Organizations

- Difficulty finding sustainable funding
- Administrative burden of grant applications
- Notification delays in status of grant applications
- · Competition for arts funding dollars

Human Resources Challenges of Sector Organizations

- Relatively transient population leads to a difficulty in staff, volunteer and client retention
- Staff burnout
- Difficulty in retaining local artists

Participant Comments: Lethbridge – January 7, 2010

Communication/Collaboration within the Sector

- Believe sector communication/collaboration could be strengthened across province
- Development of central contact listing for e-newsletter for information sharing

Capacity Challenges of Sector Organizations

- Sustainability of arts organizations is a key concern
- Need to plan for funding the ongoing core operations of arts facilities

Human Resource Challenges of Sector Organizations

- Difficulty attracting and retaining both volunteers and employees
- Need to examine attracting Alberta youth to sector organizations for example, creating intern opportunities

Funding Challenges of Sector Organizations

- Difficulty developing funding relationships with for-profit corporations
- Need to more actively engage corporate sector

Promoting Value of the Sector

- Necessity in communicating value of the arts to for-profit donors and Alberta as a whole
- Focus on both economic and quality-of-life benefits, including value of not-for-profit investment return to Albertans

Reaching Young Albertans

- Interest in advocating for expanding arts education in Alberta schools
- Expanding use of technology by arts groups may attract Alberta youth
- Develop programming/opportunities specific to youth

Participant Comments: Calgary – January 8, 2010

Communication/Collaboration within the Sector

- Geographic silos resulting in lack of communication amongst provincial arts groups
- Need for province-wide arts advocate
- Development of central contact listing for e-newsletter for information sharing
- Communicating benefit of arts programming to community interests

Promoting Value of the Sector

- Necessity in communicating value of the arts to for-profit donors and Alberta as a whole
- Focus on both economic and quality-of-life benefits, including value of not-for-profit investment return to Albertans
- Digital media can be leveraged as a tool to share the arts with Albertans Cultural Policy pillar of accessibility.

Funding Challenges of Sector Organizations

- Difficulty developing funding relationships with for-profit corporations
- Role for government to act as a facilitator in developing those relationships

Reaching Young Albertans

- Advocating for expanding arts education in Alberta schools
- Concern regarding sustainability in developing talent by arts organizations
- Identified need for funding/access to arts camps

Participant Comments: Red Deer – February 1, 2010

Capacity Challenges of Sector Organizations

- Concern over facility size in Red Deer a new facility is required to make local arts programming more sustainable
- Efforts complicated by competition with other capital campaigns to raise development funds
- Competition amongst arts festivals for patrons leads to diminished attendance need for increased cooperation to ensure maximum benefit for the community
- Belief that delivery of programming at the grassroots level has diminished in part due to a lack of affordable conference space

Communication within the Sector

- Recognition for the need of a singular voice for advocating the arts in Alberta
- Need for enhanced communication across the sector sharing of information, best practices

Funding Challenges of Sector Organizations

- Require additional access to core operational funding particularly in relation to the cost of limited performance venues
- Cultural heritage groups generally lack core funding

Reaching Young Albertans

- Recognize need to promote the arts in the K-12 curriculum; emphasize the role the arts plays in creating creative and analytical thinkers
- Emphasis on catering to youth through programming and making creative spaces available for use to Alberta youth
- Desire to ensure youth participate in the arts through a variety of means (volunteerism, youth/family programming)

Participant Comments: Edmonton – February 3, 2010

Capacity Challenges of Sector Organizations

- Concern over diminishing attendance at some arts events
- Call for special funding for arts administrators
- Recognize need to share performance spaces

Communication within the Sector

Need for a singular provincial voice for advocating the arts

Funding Challenges of Sector Organizations

- Difficulty accessing start-up funds (small loans)
- Recognize need to develop collective buying power of insurance, etc.
- Administrative burden of grant applications

Promoting Value of the Sector

- Necessity in communicating value of the arts to for-profit donors and Alberta as a whole, both economic and quality-of-life benefits
- Need to communicate research demonstrating economic impact of the arts
- Recognize the integral role technology can play in sharing art of all forms with Albertans

Reaching Young Albertans

- Recognize need to strongly position the arts in the K-12 curriculum to foster creativity and excellence as well as appreciation for value of the arts in quality of life
- Emphasis on attracting youth through programming and making creative spaces available for use to Alberta youth

Online Dialogue Question 1: What is going well with the work you are doing?

- Respondents indicated that Alberta's individual artists and arts organizations continue to produce innovate, creative and excellent artistic works. This is reflected in overall growing audiences, demand for new artistic products and the creation of new companies, venues and online arts resources.
- Alberta's arts sector benefits from strong organizational management and efficacy, highlighted by committed and qualified professional staff; strong boards; a passionate and dedicated volunteer base; diverse programming activities; and the incorporation of new technological tools to share and promote art, artists and events.
- Increased collaboration including cooperation in advocacy for the arts, programming relationships and facility sharing agreements.

Online Dialogue Question 2: What are the major challenges you face?

- The most frequently cited challenge was funding, including concerns about the sufficiency of public funding at municipal, provincial and federal levels. The unpredictable level of funding from year-to-year was specifically referenced as being detrimental to long-term planning.
- Some respondents commented on their inability to access both project and operational funding and the lack of secure multi-year funding. Other comments described the application process for grants as being time-consuming and difficult.
- The high-use cost and lack of accessibility of performance, practice and administrative space is a concern.

Minister's Dialogue with the Arts Sector Online Dialogue Summary

Online Dialogue Question 3: What practices have been effective in managing your organization's operations to meet your mandate?

- Respondents said the most effective reflected sound organizational management practices including fiscally responsible planning; strategic planning; program and policy review; human resource management and volunteer recruitment; and the adoption of promotional strategies embracing social media and new technology.
- Partnerships between sector organizations on facilities, programming and resources.
- Alternative fundraising including individual donor campaigns and corporate sponsorship.

Online Dialogue Question 4: What successes and challenges have you had in working with other organizations to meet your mandate?

- The collaborative success identified by respondents was resource sharing including: financial, promotional/marketing, facilities, volunteer pools and best practices.
- A primary challenge in implementing collaboration among groups in the arts sector was the perspective that organizations were in competition for audiences and facility space.
- Some respondents said it can be difficult to find the "right" partner, particularly across artistic disciplines. A knowledge gap was cited, as some organizations lack sufficient experience or training in organizational partnership.

Online Dialogue Question 5: Financial support aside, what could the provincial government do to help you address these major challenges?

- Respondents indicated the Government of Alberta could assist the arts sector by helping
 to promote the value and importance of the arts to Albertans, both economically and to
 Alberta's quality of life. This may include highlighting specific Alberta artists and arts
 organizations.
- The government might facilitate sharing of provincial facility space with the non-profit sector and implement incentives for more affordable space for non-profit arts groups.
- Assistance in effective use of sector networking was cited for:
 - Sharing of best practices (arts symposium/conference); and
 - Opportunities to develop relationships with the corporate sector.

Online Dialogue Question 6: Who else could help?

- Federal/municipal governments programming to support the arts.
- Tourism organizations in promoting arts within travel packages.
- News Media could work with the sector in communicating stories of the value of the arts to the community.
- Corporate Sector can assist financially and non-financially, with skills and in-kind support.

Online Dialogue Question 7: Other comments on the Arts Sector.

- There is significant pride in the arts sector. Respondents noted their belief that Alberta's arts talent is unrivalled in the country.
- Respondents reiterated their belief that Albertans and the Government of Alberta need to understand the positive value of the arts sector to Alberta.
- The arts sector has been innovative, resilient and determined in coping with short and long-term challenges.
