Upgrading and Refining

Production

- In 2012, Alberta produced about 1.9 million barrels per day (bbl/d) of crude bitumen from three oil sands regions – Athabasca, Cold Lake and Peace River, with surface mining accounting for 48% and in-situ for 52% of the production.
- In 2012, about 54%, or 1,044,000 bbl/d of crude bitumen production, was sent for upgrading in Alberta.

Upgrading

 There are currently five operating upgraders in Alberta with the capacity to handle approximately 1.3 million bbl/d of bitumen.

- Most upgraders produce synthetic crude oil, but some also produce products such as diesel.
- Upgraders (and refineries) also produce off-gases, gaseous mixtures rich in alkanes and alkenes, which are potential feedstocks for Alberta's petrochemical industry.

 There are four operating refineries in Alberta with a combined crude processing capacity of over 457,000 bbl/d.
