Circumstances under which Death occurred:

Mr. Upton ingested the fatal dosage found in his body which had been illicitly obtained within the Drumheller Penetentiary.

Recommendations for the prevention of similar deaths:

No Recommendations

I – Since 2011 Fentanyl has been identified as a drug which obtained and ingested from non-medically prescribed sources to be dangerous to health and fatal because of the unknown concentration of the drug so obtained.

Subsequent to 2011, Narcan nasal spray (Naloxone hydrochloride) has been made available and placed with Corrections Canada personnel. Narcan is used to temporarily reverse the effects of an opioid overdose until emergency services arrive. A Naxolone Guideline for Correctional Service Canada, 14 September 2016, has been provided together with training and policy for corrections personnel to identify the possible need for and use of Narcon in medical emergency situations arising from opioid overdoses.

II – Witness testimony was heard from Canada Corrections officials in respect of security measures at Correction Facilities directed to prevention of illicit drugs entering into the institutions, and as to the regular monitoring of inmates when in cells.
