# Indicators at a glance

### **New: Oil Prices**

WTI decreased \$4.73 over the week and closed at US\$73.67 on Thursday. The WTI-WCS differential closed at US\$26.70 per barrel, narrowed from a week ago.

### **New:** Labour Market

Employment increased by 24,500 in October. Compared to a year ago, it was up by 88,800. The next release is on February 10, 2023.



### **New:** Economic Activity

The Alberta Activity Index increased in October (0.2% month-over-month), and was up 5.6% from a year ago. Alberta's real GDP by expenditure increased by 4.8% in 2021, following a large decline in 2020.

Year-over-year % change




### **New:** Business Output

Manufacturing shipments increased 7.3% m/m to \$9.5 billion in October. Compared to a year ago, they were up 29%.

Alberta goods exports decreased 6.1% m/m in November to \$16.7 billion. However, they were up 20% from a year ago.

Year-over-year % change





## **New:** Average Weekly Earnings

Average weekly earnings in Alberta decreased 0.4% m/m in October to \$1,259. They were up 3.2% from a year ago.

## **New:** Population Growth

Alberta's population was 4,601,314 as of October 1, 2022, an increase of 3.0% from the year prior. During the last 12 months, Alberta welcomed 79,992 net international migrants and saw a net inflow of 37,117 interprovincial migrants.

### **New: Inflation**


The consumer price index in Alberta increased 6.6% y/y in November, down from 6.8% y/y in October.

### **New: Retail Sales**

Alberta retail sales increased 1.5% m/m to \$8.1 billion in October. Compared to a year ago, sales were up 6.6%.

### **New:** Housing Market

Alberta housing starts declined 34% m/m in November to 31,936 units (SAAR). They were down 24% from a year ago. The number of home sales in the resale market went down 3.8% m/m to 5,604 units in November, and were down 28% y/y.

Year-over-year % change






### **REAL GDP BY EXPENDITURE**

(2021, year-over-year growth)




### **CPI INFLATION**

(November 2022, year-over-year growth)




### **UNEMPLOYMENT RATE**

(December 2022)




### **EMPLOYMENT**

(December 2022, year-over-year growth)




### **AVERAGE WEEKLY EARNINGS**
