

New: Oil Prices


WTI decreased \$5.13 over the week and closed at US\$75.88 on Thursday. The WTI-WCS differential closed at US\$22.90 per barrel, narrower than a week ago.

Employment increased by 11,900 in December. Compared to a year ago, it was up by 81,800. The next release is on February 10, 2023.




New: Economic Activity

The Alberta Activity Index decreased in November (-0.4% month-over-month), and was down 2.9% from a year ago. Alberta's real GDP by expenditure increased by 4.8% in 2021, following a large decline in 2020.

Year-over-year % change




Alberta's employment rate was 5.6% in December, down from




Business Output

Manufacturing shipments decreased 3.0% m/m to \$9.2 billion in November. Compared to a year ago, they were up 20%.

Alberta goods exports decreased 6.1% m/m in November to \$16.7 billion. However, they were up 20% from a year ago.

MANUFACTURING SHIPMENTS AND GOODS EXPORTS Year-over-year % change




New: Rigs Drilling

The number of rigs drilling in Alberta averaged 192 in January, up 12% from a year ago.

Average Weekly Earnings

Average weekly earnings in Alberta increased 1.2% m/m in November to \$1,278. They were up 3.8% from a year ago.

Population Growth

Alberta's population was 4,601,314 as of October 1, 2022, an increase of 3.0% from the year prior. During the last 12 months, Alberta welcomed 79,992 net international migrants and saw a net inflow of 37,117 interprovincial migrants.

Inflation

The consumer price index in Alberta increased 6.0% y/y in December, down from 6.6% y/y in November.

Retail Sales

Alberta retail sales remained essentially unchanged (-0.08% m/m) or \$8.1 billion in November. Compared to a year ago, sales were up 6.0%.

Housing Market

Alberta housing starts declined 15% m/m in December to 26,813 units (SAAR). They were down 17% from a year ago. The number of home sales in the resale market edged up 0.1% m/m to 5,612 units in December, but were down 30% y/y.




REAL GDP BY EXPENDITURE

(2021, year-over-year growth)




UNEMPLOYMENT RATE

(December 2022)




AVERAGE WEEKLY EARNINGS

(November 2022, year-over-year growth)




CPI INFLATION

(December 2022, year-over-year growth)




EMPLOYMENT
