
# Alberta economy

### **New: Oil Prices**

WTI increased \$1.61 over the week and closed at US\$69.96 on Thursday. The WTI-WCS differential closed at US\$14.85 per barrel, narrower than a week ago.





Employment increased by 1,600 in February. Compared to a year ago, it was up by 76,900. The next release is on April 6, 2023.

### **Economic Activity**

The Alberta Activity Index decreased in December (-1.0% month-over-month), and was up 3.6% from a year ago. Alberta's real GDP by expenditure increased by 4.8% in 2021, following a large decline in 2020.






Alberta's unemployment rate was 5.8% in February, down from 6.0% in January, but 0.6 percentage points lower than a year ago.




### **Business Output**

Manufacturing shipments increased 11% m/m to \$9.7 billion in January. Compared to a year ago, they were up 22%.

Alberta goods exports increased 3.1% m/m in January to \$15.6 billion. However, they were up 8.3% from a year ago.

#### MANUFACTURING SHIPMENTS AND GOODS EXPORTS Year-over-year % change




# **Rigs Drilling**

The number of rigs drilling in Alberta averaged 190 in February, up 7.0% from a year ago.

# **Average Weekly Earnings**

Average weekly earnings in Alberta decreased 0.7% m/m in December to \$1,268. They were up 2.2% from a year ago.

# **New:** Population Growth

Alberta's population was 4,647,178 as of January 1, 2023, an increase of 3.7% from the year prior. During the last 12 months, Alberta welcomed 99,974 net international migrants and saw a net inflow of 45,526 interprovincial migrants.

# **New: Inflation**


The consumer price index in Alberta increased 3.6% y/y in February, down from 5.0% y/y in January.

# **New: Retail Sales**

Alberta retail sales increased 2.9% m/m to \$8.7 billion in January. Compared to a year ago, sales were up 13%.

# **Housing Market**

Alberta housing starts increased 11% m/m in February to 31,112 units (SAAR). They were down 1% from a year ago. The number of home sales in the resale market were down 0.4% m/m to 5,317 units in February, and were down 45% y/y.






#### UNEMPLOYMENT RATE

(February 2023)




#### AVERAGE WEEKLY EARNINGS

(December 2022, year-over-year growth)




#### **CPI INFLATION**

(February 2023, year-over-year growth)




#### EMPLOYMENT
