Trends and Outlook

According to Statistics Canada's National Economic Accounts, the Forestry and Logging with Support Activities industry accounted for approximately 0.2% of Alberta's Gross Domestic Product in 2010, the same as in 2000. The industry's share of Alberta's total employment decreased from 0.3% in 2000 to 0.2% in 2010.

Employment in 2010 was 21.4% higher than its level in 2009. Over the last ten years, employment declined form 5,400 people in 2000 to 3,400 people in 2010.

According to *Alberta Occupational Demand Outlook 2011-2015*, employment growth in the Logging and forestry workers; Logging machinery operators; and other occupations is expected to be below 2.7%, the average for all occupations.

As a result, the total number of employees by establishment size will not be the same as total employment in the industry, except by coincidence.

According to the Labour Force Survey, the gender breakdown in the Forestry, Logging with Support Activities industry is as follows:

- women employed: 20.6%
- men employed: 2,700 people, or 79.4%


In Alberta, women accounted for 45.1% and men made up 54.9% of total employment.
