## Alberta Child Benefit and Alberta Family Employment Tax Credit

Compiled from data collected by the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA)

## Introduction

This report presents estimates of the number of families and the number of children who received the Alberta Child Benefit (ACB) or the Alberta Family Employment Tax Credit (AFETC) and the average annual benefit amount by Provincial Electoral Divisions (PED) for the 2016-17 benefit year. A PED is a territorial unit represented by an elected Member to serve in the Alberta Provincial Legislative Assembly. This report is based on the electoral boundaries that will be in effect for the 2019 Provincial General Election.

The ACB is a refundable tax credit that provides direct financial assistance to lower-income families with children under 18 who have a family net income of less than a specified amount (\$41,220 per year for the 2016-17 benefit year). The AFETC is a refundable tax credit paid to lower- and middle-income families that have working income and children under 18 years of age. Unlike with the ACB, families must earn at least \$2,760 in employment income to receive the AFETC.

The ACB and the AFETC programs are administered by the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) on behalf of the Province of Alberta. The data used to produce this report came from the CRA for the 2016-17 benefit year, which started in July 2016 and ended in June 2017.
