



Law Enforcement Review Board Hearings – September 2016

September 2, 2016

The Law Enforcement Review Board will hear final arguments on the following appeal in Edmonton:

Oxford Tower, 15th Floor, 10025-102 A Avenue, Edmonton.

September 7, 2016 (9 a.m.)

 Mr. K. Steele filed complaints alleging that the officer applied inappropriate force by shooting his pistol at him during his arrest. This appeal arises from a previous decision of the Board where the matter was remitted to the same Presiding Officer to articulate the reasons for his decision to acquit the officer.

September 21, 2016 (9 a.m.)

 Ms. C. Kovacs filed complaints alleging officers breached confidentiality, made unprofessional and rude comments, did not return phone calls, and failed to pursue criminal breach charges against someone who was threatening her.

September 23, 2016 (9 a.m.)

 Mr. B. Mufuta filed complaints alleging that officers provided false information on a warrant, conducted a negligent investigation, humiliated him and kept him in handcuffs for an excessive period of time.

September 30, 2016 (9 a.m.)

 Mr. D. Chestnut filed complaints alleging the officer conducted a negligent investigation and improperly charged him without reasonable grounds.

An independent body established pursuant to the *Police Act* in 1973, the Alberta Law Enforcement Review Board reviews public complaints about police officer conduct. The board also reviews police officers' appeals on disciplinary action.
