RESOURCE AUTHORIZATION CATEGORIES

Knowledge and Employability Resources

The resource lists for Knowledge and Employability courses contain learning and teaching resources that have been authorized for use in Alberta schools.

Alberta Education selects and authorizes resources to support the implementation of programs of study. Teachers are encouraged to select resources that meet the diverse learning needs of students they teach. The resource authorization categories are **student basic**, **student support** or **teaching**:

Student Basic learning resources are those student learning resources authorized by Alberta Education as the most appropriate for addressing the majority of outcomes of the course(s) or substantial components of the course(s); or the most appropriate for meeting general outcomes across two or more grade levels.

Student Support learning resources are those student learning resources authorized by Alberta Education to assist in addressing some of the outcomes of the course(s) or components of the course(s); or to assist in meeting the outcomes across two or more grade levels.

Teaching resources are those teaching resources identified as the best available resources to support the implementation of programs of study and courses; they may be teacher guides to accompany student resources or teacher professional resources. The authorized teaching guides are listed with the student resources.

These resources are organized by grade, authorization status and title in alphabetical order. Series names are italicized. Grade level(s) are indicated beside each title and there is a cross-reference column to other Knowledge and Employability subjects on the right side of the page.

Note:

Alberta Education strongly recommends that teachers read all selections in the student resources and all activities in the teacher guides prior to using them with students. Careful consideration should be given to the sensitivities of both the student audience and the community, and to the reading levels of students.

The Alberta Framework of Essential Competencies consists of a set of essential competencies (skills, knowledge and work effort) that promote success in everyday living. The folder also includes information that explains the framework and how it can be used. The competencies are organized into four dimensions: Building Personal Capacity, Interacting and Communicating, Planning and Managing, and Using Data and Computer Technology. Within each dimension there are two sub-competency areas; e.g., Building Personal Capacity is divided into Personal Management and Managing Transitions. The other sub-competency areas are Working with Others, Communicating (including ESL and literacy), Thinking, Achieving Results, Numeracy, and Computer Technology. Each competency has five performance indicators that can be taught and learned, and the outcome observed. An individual can start where he or she is and progress as he or she wishes. The individual competency statements are intended to be incorporated into new and existing curricula. The accompanying CD-ROM Action Planner is a Word document that encompasses the competencies and a self-assessment form that teachers may use with students in part or in whole to identify strengths and opportunities for growth.

For each lesson, the teacher's edition shows an illustration of the student text pages and a summary of the lesson. A warm-up activity, mathematics vocabulary and a suggestion for teaching the lesson are also included. A Learning Styles section provides tips on teaching students who have different learning styles. In the Community, At Home and Career Interest Inventory sections include ideas for class discussion of real-world applications for the various mathematics operations. It also points out a variety of common errors made by students, technology connections and mental mathematics challenges. The alternate activities that correspond with the lesson are illustrated on the same page as the lesson. Alternative assessments using a variety of media provide for assessment of a broad range of knowledge, skills and attitudes.

The student text is divided into 13 chapters: Whole Numbers; Number Theory; Fractions; Decimals; Ratio and Proportion; Percent; Introduction to Geometry; Metric Measurement; Customary Measurement; Measuring Circles, Cylinders, and Time; Graphs; Scale Drawing; and Introduction to Algebra. The lessons are clearly defined with a bold heading on the top of each page. There are adequate student practice exercises.

The teacher's resource library CD–ROM includes mastery tests for each chapter, a midterm test and a final test. It also includes a set of blackline masters that cover the same content as the regular activities, but are written at a lower grade level. The answers to the assessments on the CD–ROM are given in the teacher's edition.

Comments:

• Many pages of practice are included without providing a context. Teachers will have to modify these to include a context that is relevant to their students' experiences.

• The student text is relatively text-heavy. Some sections are not part of the Knowledge and Employability Mathematics course, while the Statistics and Probability Strand is not covered.

• At various places in the teachers' resources, references are made to an "Online Connection." Alberta Education does not review or authorize these Web sites. Teachers are encouraged to preview these Web sites before allowing their students to use them.


