In February 2014, Mediation Services received settlement information regarding 51 bargaining relationships encompassing 12,040 employees. There were 22 private sector and 29 public sector settlements, covering 7,484 and 4,556 employees respectively.

In January 2014, approximately 405,300 Albertans were covered by union agreements. Alberta's union coverage rate was 21.59% while nationwide the union coverage rate was 30.77%.*

Mediation Services - Who We Are

Mediation Services is a branch of the Safe, Fair and Healthy Workplaces division of Alberta Jobs, Skills, Training and Labour. Under the Labour Relations Code, the Director of Mediation Services is responsible for appointing mediators to collective bargaining disputes between employers and unions. In Alberta, the parties to a labour dispute must go through the mediation process before they can exercise their right to strike, lockout or access a dispute resolution tribunal. Mediation Services also appoint arbitrators to grievance arbitrations when the parties are unable to agree to one.

All collective agreements under the Labour Relations Code and the Police Officers Collective Bargaining Act must be filed with the Director of Mediation Services. The information from these agreements is used to produce publications and wage related statistics. Please contact Mediation Services to inquire about customized reports. 



Wage Settlements in Alberta Weighted Average % Annual Change by Sector 2013-2018







Average Weekly Earnings Alberta (AWEA)*









Consumer Price Index (CPI), 2002=100






