In November 2014, Mediation Services received settlement information regarding 43 bargaining relationships encompassing 8,446 employees. There were 29 private sector and 14 public sector settlements, covering 3,563 and 4,883 employees respectively.

Grievance Mediation – Are You Interested?

Under the Labour Relations Code, the Director of Mediation Services is responsible for appointing arbitrators to collective agreement disputes (grievance arbitrations) when the parties are unable to agree on one. Arbitrators are also required to file their decisions with the Director and most comply with that requirement. The vast majority of arbitration appointments are done outside of this system and anecdotal evidence suggests that the total number of scheduled arbitrations per year could be upwards of 2000. Yet typically, there are less than 100 arbitration decisions filed with the Director each year.

In Alberta, as in most provinces, the vast majority of grievances settle without a hearing and typically they settle close to the arbitration date. The wait time to get to arbitration is significant. The cost of preparation for arbitration, the cancellation fees and the delay before hearing often result in uncertainty for the parties and significant costs.

Grievance mediation can be an effective method of resolving disputes in a timely and cost effective manner. Many of the mediators on our provincial roster also engage in grievance mediation and can provide early dates and reasonable fees. They bring years of experience in dealing with collective agreement clauses and understand the efficient use of grievance mediation meetings.






Wage Settlements in Alberta Weighted Average % Annual Change by Industry





Average Weekly Earnings Alberta (AWEA)*











Consumer Price Index (CPI), 2002=100







