Update on Pediatric Standing Frame Benefits and Walkers

Pediatric Standing Frames

Alberta Aids to Daily Living (AADL) consulted with therapists whose clients use pediatric standing frames to review the eligibility criteria for AADL funded pediatric standing frames. Work included a review of available research and literature and discussions on the purpose, clinical use, practicality and benefits of pediatric standing frames within the contextual significance of AADL's parameters.

The results of this collaborative work yielded a clear set of criteria for AADL Pediatric Standing Frames and Walkers, a new Assessment Summary Form for Pediatric Standing Frames and mutually understood language for use in policy around the purpose of these benefits that is in keeping with AADL's mandate.

If criteria is met and supported by the new Assessment Summary for Pediatric Standing Frame Benefits form, standing frames and walkers will not be considered duplicate benefits for the same function.

Effective May 1, 2016, all authorizations for Pediatric Standing Frame benefits require the authorizer to complete an AADL Assessment Summary for Pediatric Standing Frame Benefits. This must be attached to the authorization form for pediatric standing frames and submitted to AADL. Pediatric Walkers

Due to a number of concerns brought forward, AADL is suspending orders for the Trekkor Gait Trainer. The manufacturer has been made aware and is working on solutions. In the meantime, new authorizations or authorizations waiting for back ordered Trekkor walker/parts are going to be given the opportunity to substitute their choice with another walker. The Rifton Gait Trainer upcharge is being temporarily waived to ensure all clients have access to this walker if it meets the client's basic needs.
