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Alberta Aids to Daily Living (AADL)

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Important Information for Seating Authorizers and Vendors

Effective immediately, AADL will no longer coordinate the Alberta Seating Education Program.

AADL will continue to offer information and training for AADL Authorizers regarding AADL policies and procedures for the provision of AADL Seating Benefits. The program manual will be updated in the near future to reflect these changes.

Clinical education is still required prior to authorizing for an AADL Seating Benefit. A variety of sources can provide this training, including conferences, in-services, workshops and courses. Examples of wheelchair and seating education include, but are not limited to:
