## **Seating Benefits Working Group**

AADL is looking for interested stakeholders to participate in a working group to discuss and review issues regarding access to AADL seating benefits.

Working group members will be providing input on current and alternative requirements to be a Seating Authorizer or Vendor and levels/classifications of seating benefits.

The AADL program currently provides seating benefits to eligible Albertans through agreements with 20 AADL approved seating vendors across Alberta via 13 Seating Clinics.

AADL is seeking members that represent:

- Seating Authorizers and Technicians
- Non-Seating Authorizers
- Community based services
- Facility based services (long term care or supportive living)
- o Remote, rural communities
- Urban communities

Members will serve for approximately two-three months, ending by February 28, 2015 (four to six meetings).
