# Fiscal Spotlight

## **Alberta Net Contribution to Confederation**

Alberta is a large net contributor to the federal fiscal balance - Albertans paid an estimated \$21.1 billion (\$5,725/person) more to the federal government than they got back in the form of services in 2009.

For 2009, Albertans paid an estimated \$40.5 billion to the federal government in taxes and other payments, while getting back \$19.3 billion in federal services. That's a difference of \$21.1 billion (or \$5,725 per Albertan).

Alberta contributes relatively more to Confederation than any other province. In fact, on a per capita basis, the federal government collects the most revenue from Alberta and spends the least here. In 2007, the last year for which data is available for all provinces, Albertans contributed a net of \$5,550 per person to the federal government, compared to \$1,756 for Ontario and \$1,339 for British Columbia. All other provinces were net recipients. The four Atlantic Provinces are the biggest fiscal beneficiaries of Confederation.

- In 2009, Alberta residents and firms contributed an estimated \$40.5 billion to federal coffers. Over half of the amount paid was in the form of personal income taxes, but there were also sizeable corporate income taxes and indirect taxes (e.g. gasoline tax, GST). The Alberta government does not transfer money directly to the federal government. Albertans face the same federal tax regime as other Canadians but contribute considerably more because of their higher average incomes they paid \$5,742 per capita in direct taxes from persons in 2007 compared to \$3,852 per capita for Ontario which is the second highest contributor.
- In 2009, Albertans received back an estimated \$19.3 billion in federal services, representing only 48 per cent of the revenue they contributed. An estimated \$7.4 billion was transfers to persons (e.g. El, Old Age Security), while the provincial government received \$4.3 billion in federal transfers (mostly the Canada Health and Social Transfers). Another \$4.1 billion took the form of direct federal expenditure on goods and services. Per capita federal spending on goods and services in Alberta is the lowest among provinces the spending in Alberta in 2007 (\$1034/person) was almost four times lower than the spending in Nova Scotia (\$3980/person). Even though the federal government is physically centered in Ottawa/Hull, direct federal spending per capita is highest in the Atlantic provinces, much of which is intended as economic development.


#### Definitions:


- 1. Personal income taxes
- 2. Corporate income taxes and capital taxes
- 3. Withholding taxes on dividends, interest, royalties, and management fees paid to non-residents
- 4. Employer and employee employment insurance contributions
- 5. Goods and services tax, excise taxes (alcohol, tobacco and fuel), customs duties
- 6. Licenses, permits, fines and penalties
- 7. Interest on government-held funds and on loans and advances, remittances from government enterprises
- 8. Provincial government contributions to the Net Income Stabilization Account, an income support program for the agriculture sector administered by the federal government
- 9. Total revenue
- 10. Employee wages and salaries, including military, spending on other goods and services including rent
- 11. Employment insurance benefits, old age security benefits, guaranteed income supplement, excludes CPP
- 12. Subsidies, including agriculture
- 13. CHT/CST, Labour Market Development Agreements, crop insurance
- 14. Grants in lieu of property taxes
- 15. Interest payments on federal debt held by Albertans
- 16. Total current expenditure, excludes capital spending such as capital consumption allowances
- 17. Total revenue less total current expenditure
