DIRECTOR'S ORDER UNDER SECTION 157

OF THE CONSUMER PROTECTION ACT (formerly the Fair Trading Act)

RYBEX HOLDINGS LTD. DOING BUSINESS AS WILDROSE WATER SYSTEMS

ANY EMPLOYEE, REPRESENTATIVE, AGENT OR ASSOCIATE OF RYAN H. LLOYD AND/OR RYBEX HOLDINGS LTD. DOING BUSINESS AS WILDROSE WATER SYSTEMS

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Issues

The Consumer Investigations Unit of Service Alberta opened an investigation into the activities of Ryan Lloyd and Rybex Holdings Ltd. doing business as Wildrose Water Systems.

An investigation was opened into a complaint filed with the Consumer Investigations Unit, North, Service Alberta. A resident of Edmonton, Alberta submitted the complaint. The allegation is that Ryan Lloyd and Rybex Holdings Ltd. doing business as Wildrose Water Systems entered into a prepaid contract with this consumer without possessing the required licence. In addition, the contract did not comply with the requirements of the Prepaid Contracting Business Regulation.

This activity constitutes a "prepaid contracting business" requiring a person or business to be licensed under Section 104(1) of the *Consumer Protection Act*. According to Section 5(2) of the *Designation of Trades and Business Regulation*, a prepaid contracting business means the activities of soliciting, negotiating or concluding in person, at any place other than the seller's place of business, a construction or maintenance contract in which all or part of the contract price is to be paid before all of the goods or services called for in the contract are provided. A construction of maintenance contract, in part, means a contract for the purpose of constructing a building that is to be used by the owner as the owner's own private dwelling.

As of today's date, Ryan Lloyd, Rybex Holdings Ltd. nor Wildrose Water Systems are not licensed to operate as a prepaid contracting business in the Province of Alberta.

Legislation

Consumer Protection Act

Section 104(1) No person may engage in a designated business unless the person holds a license under this Act that authorizes the person to engage in that business.

Section 35 A written direct sales contract must include

- (a) the consumer's name and address;
- (b) the supplier's name, business address, telephone number and, where applicable, fax number;
- (c) where applicable, the salesperson's name;
- (d) the date and place at which the direct sales contract is entered into;
- (e) a description of the goods or services, sufficient to identify them;
- a statement of cancellation rights that conforms with the requirements set out in the regulations;
- (g) the itemized price of the goods or services, or both;
- (h) the total amount of the direct sales contract;
- (i) the terms of payment;
- (j) in the case of a sales contract for the future delivery of goods, future provision of services or future delivery of goods together with services, the delivery date for the goods or commencement date for the services, or both;
- (k) in the case of a sales contract for the future provision of services or the delivery of goods together with services, the completion date for providing the services or the goods together with services;
- (I) where credit is extended,
 - (i) a statement of any security taken for payment, and

- (ii) the disclosure statement required under Part 9;
- (m) where there is a trade-in arrangement, a description of and the value of the trade-in;
- (n) the signatures of the consumer and the supplier.

Prepaid Contracting Business Licensing Regulation

- **Section 10** (1) This section applies to prepaid contracts in which the value of the goods or services to be provided under the contract is more than \$200.
 - (2) A person who is engaged in the prepaid contracting business must ensure that every prepaid contract that the person enters into
 - (a) complies with the requirements of section 35 of the Act, and
 - (b) sets out quality or types of materials to be used under the contract and the services and work to be carried out under the contract.
 - (3) A person who is engaged in the prepaid contracting business and who enters into a prepaid contract with a buyer must provide a copy of the signed contract to the buyer
 - (a) on or before the date work commences under it, or
 - (b) within 10 days after the buyer signs the contract, whichever occurs first.

<u>ORDER</u>

Ryan Lloyd and Rybex Holdings Ltd. doing business as Wildrose Water Systems and any employee, representative, or agent of Ryan Lloyd or Rybex Holdings Ltd. doing business as Wildrose Water Systems must immediately:

- cease entering into prepaid contracts with residential consumers until the licensing requirements have been met;
- ensure the that all prepaid contracts are in writing and include the terms required by the Prepaid Contracting Business Licensing Regulation and the Consumer Protection Act,

NON-COMPLIANCE WITH ORDER

ANY PERSON WHO FAILS TO COMPLY WITH AN ORDER OF THE DIRECTOR UNDER SECTION 157 OF THE CONSUMER PROTECTION ACT CONTRAVENES THIS ACT AND IS GUILTY OF AN OFFENCE AND MAY BE PROSECTUED PURSUANT TO SECTION 163 OF THE CONSUMER PROTECTION ACT.
