

Major Crop Production, Alberta

- In 2014, total production of major crops in Alberta was estimated at 30.2 million tonnes, 12.6% lower than 2013, but still 5.9% above the 10-year average of 28.5 million tonnes for 2004-2013.
- The decrease in production was largely due to lower yields compared to 2013, when records were achieved. However, most provincial average yields were still above their respective 10-year averages. Crop growing conditions in the province during 2014 were mainly favourable.
- Compared to the 10-year average (2004-2013), production was up for dry peas (64.3%), canola (29.0%), spring wheat (16.3%), and winter wheat (14.6%), but down for tame hay (7.6%), oats (14.5%), sugar beets (9.2%), barley (15.5%) and fall rye (39.6%).
- Wheat remained the largest crop in 2014, with production estimated at 9.4 million tonnes, followed by canola at 5.5 million tonnes, and barley at 4.1 million tonnes.
