
Proportion of Population by Language Spoken Most Often at Home, Alberta Economic Regions

- According to the 2011 Census, 66.3% of Canadians reported English as the language spoken most often at home, 21.0% reported French and 12.6% reported a non-official language. In comparison, 87.2% of Albertans reported English as the language spoken most often at home, followed by a non-official language (12.0%) and French (0.8%).
- The Red Deer economic region reported the largest proportion of Albertans using English most often at home (95.2%), followed by the Camrose-Drumheller region (93.6%) and the Banff-Jasper-Rocky Mountain House region (92.7%). The Calgary economic region reported the lowest proportion of people who use English most often at home (83.4%) amongst the Alberta economic regions and the highest proportion of people who use a non-official language most often at home (15.9%).
- The Wood Buffalo-Cold Lake economic region reported the largest proportion of people who speak French most often at home (2.0%) followed by Banff-Jasper-Rocky Mountain House (1.1%) and Athabasca-Grande Prairie-Peace River (1.0%).

Note: Language spoken most often at home refers to the language spoken most often at home by the individual at the time of the census. Other languages spoken at home on a regular basis were also collected. Non-official languages are languages other than English or French.
