<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Reduce interest rates on student loans for borrowers in repayment.</li> <li>▪ Extend interest-free status to learners on parental leave; and those completing residency requirements.</li> <li>▪ Allow lifetime loan limits to be re-extended to returning students that repay all or a portion their loans.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Implement tools to enhance debt manageability, including reduced interest rates, repayment flexibility, and continued emphasis on reasonable debt levels.</li> </ul>	<p>Enhanced ability to repay student debt.</p>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Annual tuition fee increases linked to inflation.</li> <li>▪ Expand policy to include more programs and learners.</li> <li>▪ Continue to allow differential fees and fee increases among programs.</li> <li>▪ Exempted programs include non-credit, distance learning for non-Albertans, and third-party contract.</li> <li>▪ Provide funding to address foregone tuition fee revenue for post-secondary institutions.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ The annual change in Alberta's Consumer Price Index used to calculate tuition fee increases.</li> <li>▪ Provide funding to post-secondary institutions to offset lower tuition fee increases and ensure continued quality.</li> <li>▪ Reflect that the student contribution level of 30% has largely been attained.</li> <li>▪ Ensure greater equity by including a broader range of programs and learners.</li> </ul>	<p>Tuition fee increases are predictable and stable for learners, while continuing to deliver high quality post-secondary education. Increased equity.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Enhance access to student financial assistance through simplified, user-friendly materials, technology, policies and programs.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Work with federal and provincial counterparts to reduce complexity of student financial assistance. Continue to develop materials and system changes to enhance simplicity for learners.</li> </ul>	<p>Increase simplicity and transparency for learners.
