The Honourable Margaret McCuaig-Boyd Mission to Houston, Texas March 4-7, 2018

Overview:

From March 4 – 7, 2018, Honourable Margaret McCuaig-Boyd, Minister of Energy, led an official delegation to Houston, Texas to attend the thirty-seventh annual CERAWeek conference organized by IHS Energy. CERAWeek is the premier annual international assembly of energy industry leaders, experts, government officials and policymakers, and technology innovators. The conference typically attracts nearly 3000 delegates from over 50 countries, including Alberta companies.

Mission Objectives:

- Promote Alberta investment-friendliness.
- Emphasize Alberta's support for integrated, open markets and trade, and North American energy security.
- Raise the profile of Alberta's central role in meeting U.S. refinery demand and highlight Alberta's annual increases in crude exports to the U.S.
- Explain Alberta's balanced commitment to sector growth and emissions reduction.
- Participate in a panel discussion titled "The Future of Investment and Growth in Western Canada's Hydrocarbon Industry."

Results:

Speaking at the panel discussion "The Future of Investment and Growth in Western Canada's Hydrocarbon Industry" allowed minister to deliver a powerful message to hundreds of investors and experts that emphasized Alberta's long-term investment-attractiveness. The Minister also emphasized Alberta's central role in meeting U.S. refining demand, and Alberta's commitment to remaining a reliable contributor to North American energy security.

Over the course of three days, the Minister had the opportunity to influence international stakeholders, promoting Alberta's balanced commitment to sector growth and emissions reductions, and encouraging a big-picture, longer-term view of Alberta's investment attractiveness. Meeting targets were selected for level of influence in policymaking, subject-matter expertise, and investment. Highlights and meeting themes included:

- Natural Resources Canada Minister Carr pipeline policy update and advocacy.
- Norway Minister of Petroleum and Energy energy transition update and lessons learned.
- Mexico Secretary of Energy energy regulation; NAFTA.
- Dow Chemical and SABIC (Saudi Arabia) Alberta energy diversification and value-add initiatives.
- Texas Secretary of State importance of Alberta to Texas refining; opportunities for bilateral cooperation between Alberta and Texas.
- Japan Oil, Gas and Metals National Corporation (JOGMEC) investment in Alberta; longer-term prospects for energy trade relationship.
- U.S. Department of Energy Assistant Secretary, Fossil Fuels energy transition and innovation lessons learned.
- President, USD Group crude by rail developments and lessons learned.

Other meetings include ABB, the Consul-General for Canada in Dallas, a joint session with the Canadian Association of Petroleum Producers and the American Petroleum Institute, the U.S. State Department, Statoil, and IHS Markit.

Finally, the Minister and Deputy Minister traveled to the James Baker Institute for Public Policy at Rice University to participate in a roundtable with institute experts organized by the Center for Energy Studies.

The Government of Alberta issued a <u>news release</u> on March 2, 2018, to announce the Minister's Houston Mission. The news release highlighted government's focus on promoting investment in Alberta's oil and gas industry strengthening ties with stakeholders and investors with a goal of promoting energy diversification opportunities in Alberta.
