Emergency Needs Allowance

The Emergency Needs Allowance provides assistance when:

- a situation is caused by unforeseeable circumstances beyond your control, and
- · it presents a severe health risk, and
- you cannot wait until the next Income Support benefit period, or
- you cannot access other resources

You can apply for the Emergency Needs Allowance if:

- you are a current Income Support client, or
- you are an Albertan earning an income, but you do not have enough money to cover a one-time, short-term emergency that will last no longer than a month, and
- you meet eligibility requirements

The Emergency Needs Allowance may cover emergency costs for:

- food
- damage deposit
- · accommodation such as a hotel
- clothing
- child care
- transportation
- utility arrears if you need the allowance for this more than once, you have to repay the costs
- eviction payments if you need the allowance for this more than once, you have to repay the costs

Emergency costs that may be covered, then repaid by you:

- essential appliance repairs
- essential home repairs

Individuals must prove need, such as:

- an arrears statement or eviction notice
- a utility bill or statement for utility arrears
- proof from a reliable source that the item is essential, such as an unsafe wiring notice from the fire department
