Education in Alberta

Parents in Alberta have a variety of options for their children's education, including public and separate (Catholic) schools, charter schools, private schools, home education and online learning. School calendar and holidays:

The school year is from September to June. Summer holidays: 2 months (July and August)

- Winter holidays: 2 weeks at the end of December
- Spring break: one week either late March or early April

Schools generally accept new students throughout the year. However, not every school will have room for more students. Contact the school as early as possible to find out the best time to register your child. School offices tend to close for the summer and open again around the third week of August.

Structure of school system:

The <u>Alberta Kindergarten to Grade 12 (K to 12) school system</u> includes programs for students ranging from pre-school age to senior high school age. After senior high, students may choose to continue their studies at a post-secondary institution.

7 to 9	12 to 15 years old	Junior High School	Required courses are Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Physical Education, Health and Personal Life Skills

Languages:

English and French are Canada's official languages. Classes in Alberta are most commonly taught in English, but French schools are also available.

Alberta is also known for the vast number of language courses that are offered to students. This includes Arabic, Chinese, German, Italian, Japanese, Latin, Punjabi, Spanish and yes, Ukrainian!

Some school districts in Alberta offer a *Ukrainian bilingual program*. This means that students in these programs are taught in Ukrainian for up to 50% of the time. This depends on whether the students are in Elementary, Junior High or Senior High School. Other schools also offer *Ukrainian Language and Culture* courses where the language is used to develop communication, intercultural and strategic skills, and to build an appreciation for the culture.
