Labour Force Statistics Alberta Aboriginal People Living Off-Reserve Highlights February 2013

- Alberta Aboriginal People Off Reserve had the lowest unemployment rate in Canada. The
 unadjusted three-month moving average unemployment rate was 7.9% in February 2013,
 down 0.9 percentage points from January 2013 and down 3.3 percentage points from the
 same month last year. The national rate was 12.3%, down 0.6 percentage point from the
 month before.
- Alberta's Aboriginal Off-Reserve labour force was 400 higher in February 2013 than January 2013, as employed rose by 1,000 while the unemployment fell by 700.
- The employment rate increased to 63.8% in February 2013 from 63.1% in January 2013.
- There were 81,800 employed Aboriginal people living off-reserve. Of those employed, 66,700 were employed full-time and 15,100 were employed part-time.
- Between January and February, the two industries with the most employment increases were: Forestry, Fishing, Mining, oil and Gas, up 1,600; and Accommodation and Food Services, up 900.
