Labour Force Statistics Alberta Aboriginal People Living Off-Reserve Highlights December 2013

- Alberta Aboriginal People living off-reserve had the lowest unemployment rate among
 Aboriginal People living off-reserve across Canada. The unadjusted three-month moving
 average unemployment rate was 7.5% in December 2013, down 0.3 percentage points from
 the previous month and down 2.7 percentage points from the same month last year. The
 national rate was 10.9%, down 0.1 percentage points from the month before.
- The labour force decreased by 500 and employment decreased by 200 from November to December 2013.
- In December 2013, there were 86,700 employed Aboriginal people living off-reserve. This represents 3.9% of Alberta's overall employment.
- In the Edmonton Economic Region there were 27,500 Aboriginal people employed and in the Calgary Economic Region 23,900 were employed. In the rest of Alberta, Aboriginal people employment was 35,300.
- Between November and December, the three industries with the most employment increases were: Transportation and Warehousing, 1,400; Public Administration, 800; Accommodation and Food Services, 500.
